Child Management Information System & Service (Child MISS), a unified cloud-based management tool that has integrated our shelters in India. Data pertaining to a child is fed by the Nodes which has the end-to-end details of the child. This contributes to speed, process, structure, knowledge and services for the care, protection and development of children. This tool assist both government and non-governmental organizations to document all their services and follow up in a single window system to enhance their mission for children at risk more effectively and efficiently. The software solution takes care of the data accuracy through Biometric Integration.

Data collected through Child MISS is vital to understand the children from different projects on the basis of orphan, semi orphan, medical, sport, education and aids to take actions for the welfare of the children and organization.

Data Management & Management of Children in the Young at Risk Centres

“Children love luxury. They have bad manners... and love to chatter. They no longer rise when elders enter the room. They contradict their parents... gobble up dainties at the table... and are tyrants over their teachers.”

Any parent or teacher reading this quote would wholeheartedly agree that it is the correct state of affairs today. The irony is that this statement was made by Aristotle (384 BCE – 322 BCE), a Greek Philosopher, 2500 years ago! This highlights the fact that parents, adults and social structures have been prejudiced on children. Often, we have to admit that we failed to understand children, and perhaps never will.


The expression ‘Young at Risk’ (YaR) has been used to refer to both children and young people whose safety, wellbeing and developments are put at risk through neglect, abuse and exploitation by parents, society or governments. The term also includes youngsters who demonstrate behaviour patterns which have dangerous impact on the society. Today we find such young people ranging from 6 to 19 years of age in all our YaR Centres.

Childhood experiences have a great impact in their later life. Child MISS (Management Information System & Services), a web application created by Don Bosco National YaR Forum, captures the information of all the children in YaR Centres from the day they enter. In every stage (childhood, school age, teenage, adolescence) their growth and developmental aspects (physical, emotional, mental, social, moral, cultural and spiritual) are followed up. In their growing years, children are faced with personal and interpersonal conflicts, like teasing, fooling, yelling, use of bad language, force, intimidation, etc. which lead to and result in anger, hurt, injury, broken relationship, etc. Such expressions give way to aggressive behaviours, resulting in conflicts and causing tension within the YaR centre and among the children.

Due to conflicts they are stigmatised and alienated not only by society but often by their own families and peers, and are therefore inclined to face psycho-emotional and social disturbances, particularly as they are still in growing years.

Child MISS offers a module on counselling where child issues are discussed and confidential information are fed in. Counselling has been initiated in YaR centres as a measure of assisting the children to understand their issues and situation and transform themselves and management of their lives. In the counselling module of the Child MISS, the various conflicts of the child at various stages and aspects are taken note of. Later such data could be analysed in systematic and scientific manner by social experts who take care of the young at risk.

Bringing up a child is like planting a tree. The single tree needs a forest around and proper ambient. This ambient is created by the child-friendly atmosphere of the YaR Centre, where everyone shows care and concern for the children. It is through building up a proper rapport with the children we are enabled to get genuine information from children. This implies that the caretakers are called to be truly ‘educators’, not just managers of the Centres. This paradigm shift in the ideology and practice of care of children is necessitating the deeper level analysis of their data. The ongoing efforts of Child MISS reveal that this process is influencing informed decision-making, enhancing the capacities and skills and empowering the children on their personal growth and development. The challenge is to enable the children to continue and fortify the initiated process further. Are we moving towards child-led management system so that the utilization of Child MISS becomes more relevant to children?

Power of Data

Digital transformation isn't just for Silicon Valley companies or young start-ups. It's a way of life for organizations expecting to survive in the next decade. Yes, Digitalization of data is always one step ahead for a future decade and it is mandate to convert ink into links at this point of time.

Child MISS is a web portal application that serves as a tool to monitor complete information about the organization and especially on child's development from day one and to navigate until end of his/her career in home/boarding. Entries in Child MISS are done in two ways:

1. Physical collection of details/ information
2. Feeding of data/ information

This phase is done directly by keeping the child as the focus and whereas the facilitator creates a trust in order to get the details and then fed into cloud. Feeding doesn't stop here instead it demands reflection. Reflection is the main aspect of Child MISS; reflection is not something to discuss rather it is the ultimate process to incorporate ideas and learning.

Data is processed to become information that will eventually help to build a strong Individual Care Plan (ICP) for each child. When ICP focuses on the data, it expects accuracy and that accuracy is only possible when it is properly managed. And therefore digitalization doesn't stop with feeding of data but it is also including monitoring and management of the child. When this process takes place it automatically leads to Data-driven management.

I will fail if I don't talk about the team that works behind the screen to bring a better plan. At each node systematic documentation takes places every day and data are systematically entered, studied and verified then and there. In one way, this helps to evaluate the current status, revisit the past, and restructure the future to reassure prosperity and scope of wellbeing. Future of a child depends on his/her present and obviously past plays a vital role in initial stages. To have a clear cut understanding of a child, the past, present data are very important and more over in this changing trends, data management must take a different shape altogether.

My heartfelt of thanks to whole National team, Fr. Joseph Leo, Ms. Maheshwari and Mr. Austin for their constant supervision and encouragement to lift up the Hub in a digitalized documentation system. I am thankful to Fr. Joe Prabu, the YaR Coordinator and Fr. James Raj, the Hub Director for their guidance and support in order to make Chennai Hub very energetic. My sincere thanks to Node Directors, Node Coordinators and my dear colleagues for their great support and dedication.

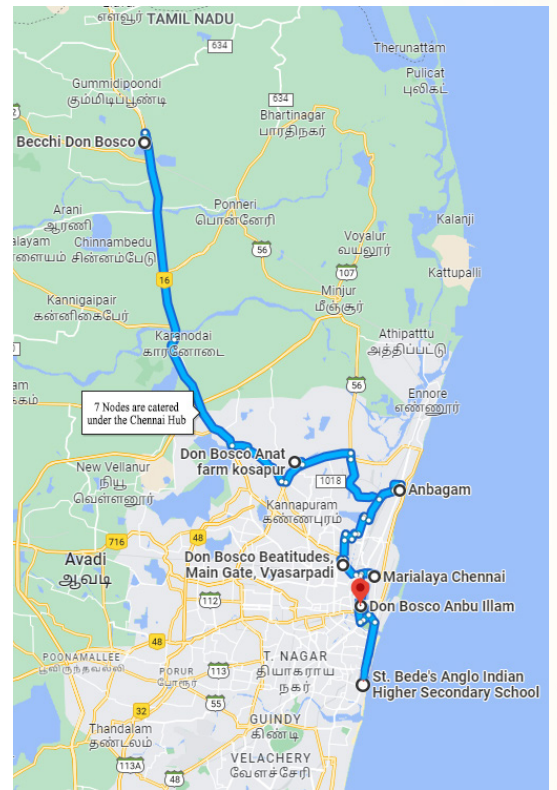
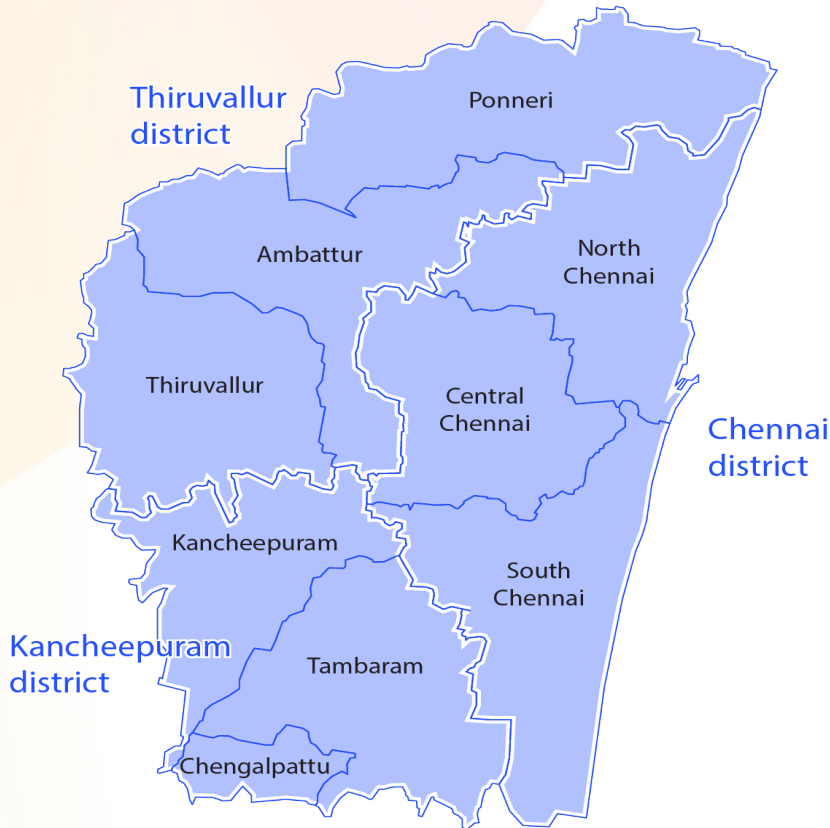

Below are some of the major points addressed during the visits.

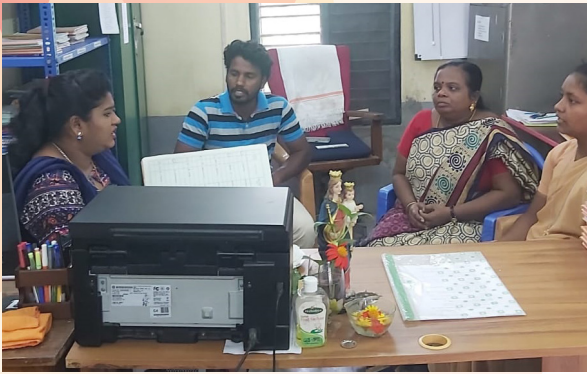
- Monitor the monthly performance

On 18th January 2022 had capacity building cum Help and Rescue Module review with Childline team along with Fr. James at DBAI head office. Total of 8 team members attended the training.



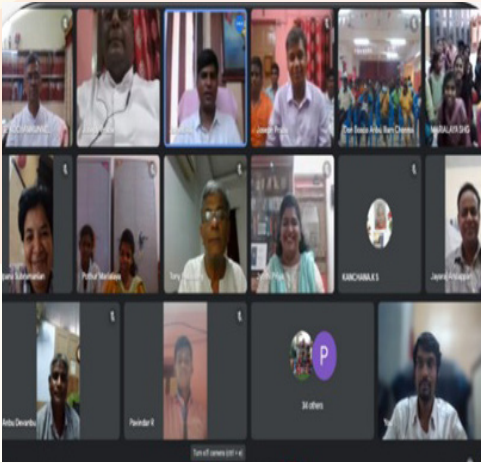
On 5th February 2022, 27 staff and Management members of Mariyalaya, Chennai attended a Digital Documentation Training on Child MISS & Mobile Application.

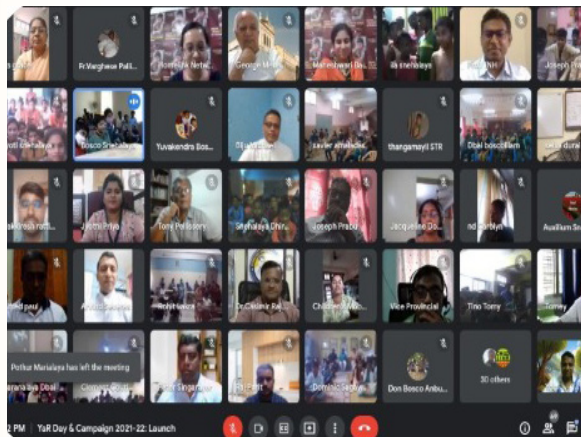
Special Events

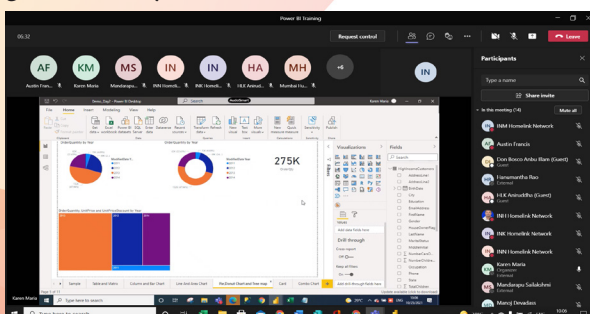
'Every Child Safe Online'

Covid 19 destitute children

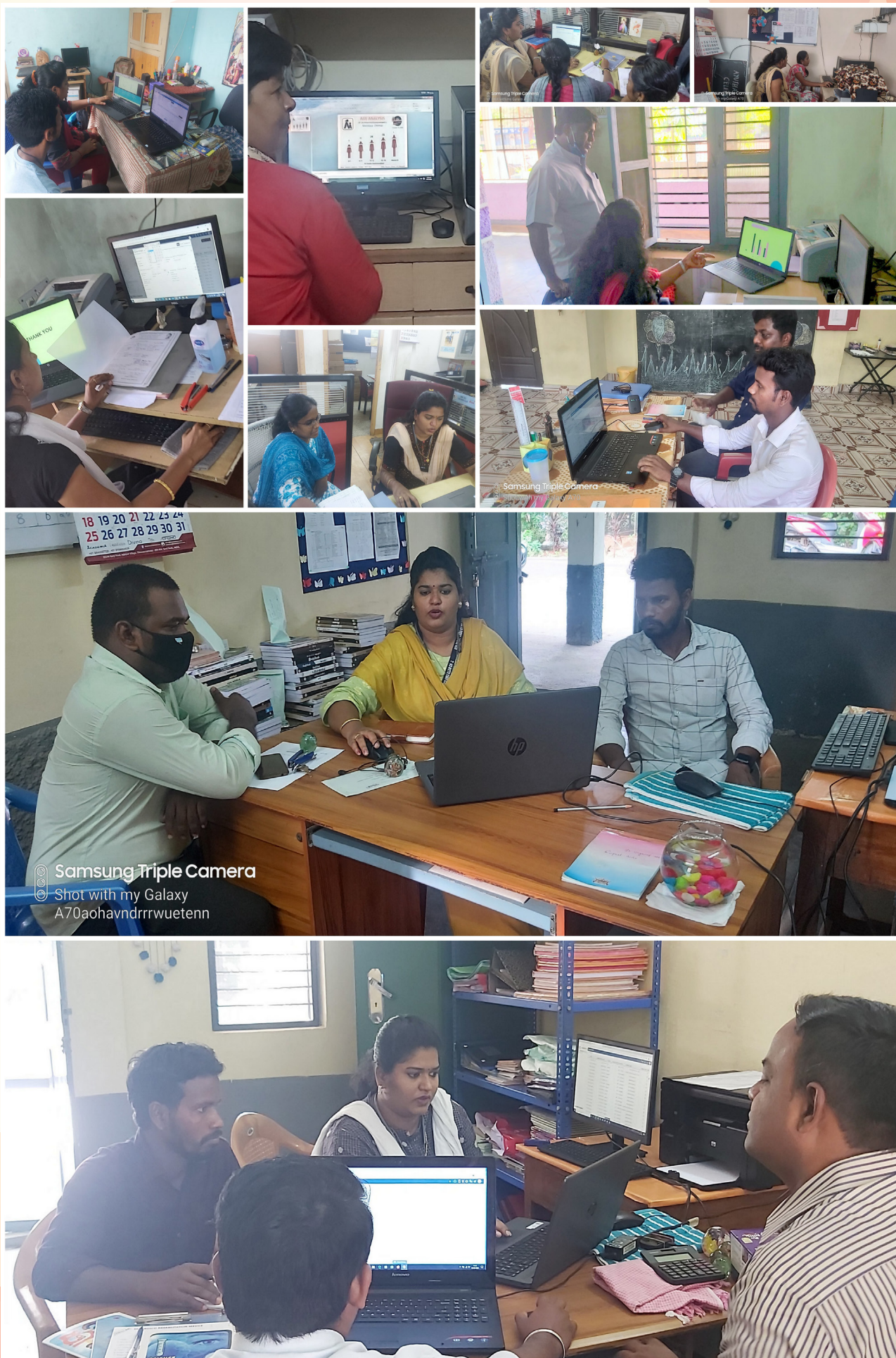

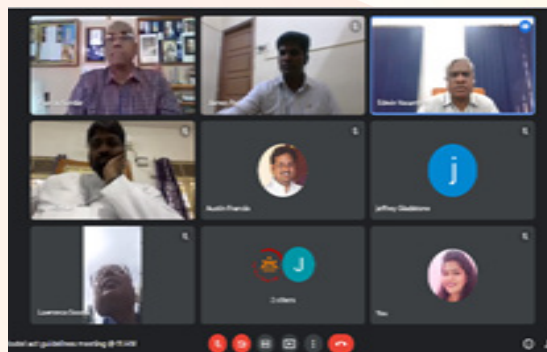

INM YaR Commission Meeting

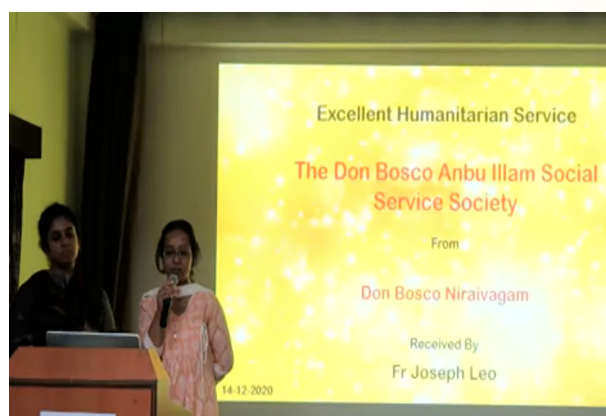

“You fall, You rise, You make mistakes, You live and You learn”

My Adolescence:

I am Haridas. I was born to Kumar and Amudha on 13 Feb, 1994 in Thiruvannamalai in a Hindu family. Up-to my 7th grade I had a happy childhood surrounded with my family and most importantly my mom was well. I was learning Yoga, Karate and Silambattam excitedly. Things got changed upside down when my mom met with an accident and went into coma. Due to the absence of my mother's love, I started making friends seeking the love and attention which I lost in my family. They used to spend money for me initially; later on, they used to ask me to bring money from home to spend. I used to steal money and jewels and give it to them. My family came to know about the things I used to do with my friends. So, my maternal uncle brought me to Kanchipuram in order to avoid my bad company. Indeed, he took good care of me and I started my 9th grade there in Kanchipuram. I also got gold medal in NCC and received best Cadet Award in 2009-2010.

Life got slipped:

One fine day when we were playing Cricket, a quarrel started between two gangs where it become so serious and ended up as a murder. All my friends got arrested. Since I was a minor, I was put in Juvenile home in Cuddalore. During the trial, I turned as an approver and judgement got passed.

Don Bosco (YaR) as a good samaritan:

“Sometimes miracles are just good people with kind hearts”

Don Bosco team visited us for summer motivational camp in May 2011. Salesian Father gave me a Bible and I used to read it daily. On the next summer camp, I worked along with them in the Government Special Home as a volunteer. Meantime I worked hard and completed 12th grade.

Fr. Vincent helped me to enrol in Salesian House for YAR children (ANAT FARM) to learn discipline, to set a goal in my life. In 2014, along with him, made a home visit and met my family after 4 years.

I spent all my summer and winter vacations with Fr. Vincent Xavier. He recommended me for Master in Social Work in Loyola College. There I took Don Bosco Prison and Correctional Ministry as my passion and inspiration throughout my study and course work. During my second year I won best Social Worker Award and Udhaya Mahalingam Award.

Path of Career:

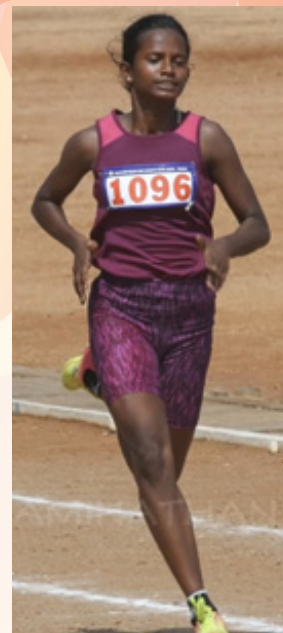
I joined as a Field executive at Prism Trust in 2019 with my earlier experience during my MSW and was promoted as Coordinator for Puzhal Prison Pattam Project. Being a coordinator, I advocated for reduction of the number of re-arrests of first-time offenders. The project was awarded as the Best Correctional Rehabilitation Program by APCA Correctional Ministry and Central Government. In 2021, I was handed over with additional responsibility at Kelly's Observation Home where I handled rehabilitation program for Juveniles. Presently I work as Life skill trainer to Youth and children, conduct motivational training Camp and Resource person for other programs across Tamil Nadu.

Rays of hope gave him a scope

I am Vignesh Kumar Jerome, my mother passed away when I was at age 3 then I came to my aunt's house to continue my education. I studied there for 7 years peacefully, then slowly I was treated as servant by my aunty and her family. On 13.04.2010, I ran away from my aunt's house to Chennai to safeguard myself. As I found shelter in Chennai Central Railway Station more than an hour, a person came to me and enquired about myself as I was poured out my sad past. The Don Bosco Staff took me to Don Bosco Anbu Illam (DBAI) Childline office. Here I was welcomed by Fr. Alphonse SDB who examined my reading and writing skills. He gave me a book and asked me to read and so on then he asked me whether I am interested in studying. On my positive affirmation to study the same day evening I was brought to Don Bosco Anbu Illam (Home of Love for Children), Chennai. After reaching the home I felt sage and happy by seeing many children there. Then I was placed in Good Samaritan Primary School in 5th std and in the next academic year I was promoted to St. Joseph's Higher Secondary School to continue my studies. I studied from 6th std to 12th std. I Studied in Tamil medium until 10th std and scored 430 marks out of 500 in board examination, especially in Social Science I secured. In higher secondary I chose commerce stream in English medium and I scored. Throughout my studies, the Salesians have been a great source of inspiration and guidance.



I applied for B.com in Loyola College, Chennai and I got selected and simultaneously I worked in Childline as a part time staff. During those days I handled Child Abuse, Child Marriage, Child Labour and Child beginning cases. Having a wide experience in short span, I was appointed as an Incharge of shelter home for urban homeless children – Boy's project under Greater Chennai Corporation. In this time, I am very great full of Fr. Joseph Leo SDB the Rector and Director of DBAI Chennai who go admission in Loyola College and at same time he has given a job for livelihood to grow up in better way. This YaR Centre has shaped in ways house has given me the strength to face any adversity in any situation and raised me as a citizen completed by graduation studies and now continue to assist the boys at DBAI Chennai. I owe an immense sense of gratitude to all the Salesians who have accompanied my life journey thus far.
