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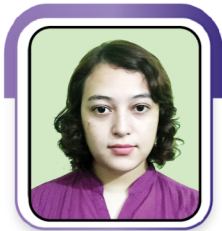


MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR'S DESK

YaR- Young at Risk

YaR is the abbreviation for Young at Risk. An initiative was taken up by the Society of Don Bosco (the Salesian Provincial Conference of South Asia) to protect the children and young from the exploitation of socially, economically, and politically causes. It caters to the young people who have been forced into situations of spacious risk and is the priority target group we reach out to; Child Labour, Missing and Neglected Children Surrender Children, HIV Infected/ Affected Children, Orphan Children, Protecting the Children from Child Marriage, etc. It is a forum of committed and dedicated citizens, organizations, and networks, working for the Young at Risk, empowering them, and accompanying them for healthy growth and transformation of their physical, mental and spiritual well-being. Salesian's YaR centers have primarily been dedicated to children in need of care and protection. However, it also works for women's empowerment and youth migrants to create a healthy society.

Don Bosco National Forum for the Young at Risk (DB YaR Forum) is a network of groups and organizations committed to the safety, growth, development, and rights of vulnerable, marginalized children and young adults who need care and protection or who are in conflict with the law. Currently, the network has 80+ member institutions and organizations from across 19 states and union territories of India. Services we offer to young people include street/railway platform/ bus station presences, rescue teams, drop-in centers, open shelters, children's homes, youth hostels, after-care facilities, and HomeLink/Missing Children. We accompany the Young at Risk, to provide for them care and protection, conducive spaces to live, work together and develop, and environments of rights, participation, and dignity.

HOMELINK NETWORK



HomeLink Network is an ongoing initiative started by DB YaR Forum in 2002. The objective of the project is to ensure appropriate, timely and real-time response to the needs of the young at risk, based on accurate documentation and data analysis supported by the best of technologies available today.

It enables organisations to develop a culture of data led management, monitoring, reporting, intervention planning, and facilitates predictive intervention planning by responding to evolving scenarios of the young at risk.

The HomeLink Network is implemented across India through 8 Hubs. Where Hubs are group of YaR Centers in a province and Nodes are individual YaR Center. At present 93 member organizations of HomeLink Network are interconnected through the web tool Child MISS (Child Management Information Systems and Services), which has the data of over 326,000 children accumulated over the years. The tool has played a key role in facilitating the restoration, home placement, of over 1,120,000 children. Between 2014 and 2021, the number of children whose details have been recorded in the Child MISS tool is 96018, of whom 60,681 have been restored to their families or guardians.



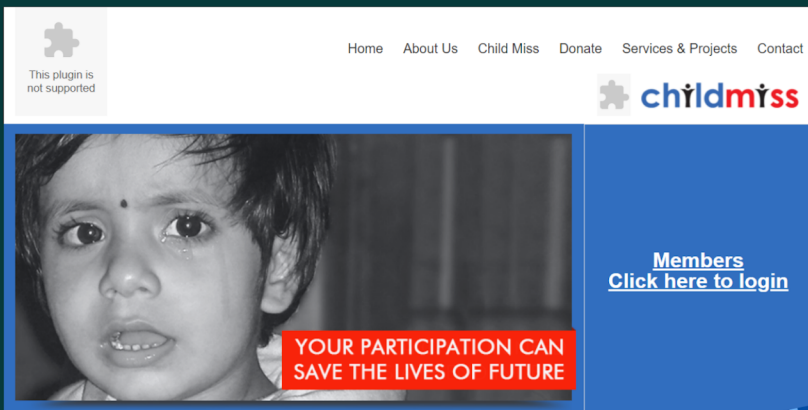
CHILD MISS

Child MISS (Management Information System and Services) is an online web portal for effective data management, monitoring, and reporting. It is a tool that provides a systematic and secure platform to document all the needs of Young at Risk.

The web tool is also linked with other value-added tools like Mobile App, Power BI, Child PPa - Bio-metric/palm reading/facial recognition technologies to provide 360-degree capacity building at node and hub levels. It also helps the partner organization in the preparation and publication of research and resource documents, micro-studies and data snippets.

The tool aims to create awareness and skills enhancement of children and organization through data and to help them reflect on their contexts and situations and to contribute to the organizational decision-making, promoting children's participation in decision-making according to their evolving capacities.

Currently, more than 100 non-governmental organizations are using the web portal to document all their services and follow up in a single-window system to enhance their mission for children at risk more effectively and efficiently.

DELHI- HUB

Delhi- Hub has 5 centers including one non- Salesians center. These centers are involved in various YaR services such as Balwadis, Non-Formal Education, Vocational Training Centres, Child Care Institute, Childline 1098, Migrants Desks, etc.

Delhi- Hub is currently operational from Don Bosco Ashalayam, Delhi other nodes include Don Bosco Ashalayam- Lucknow, Don Bosco Navjeevan Society- Chandigarh, Don Bosco Pashaur- Jhajjar, and Holy Cross Snehalaya, Lucknow.

Delhi- Hub was formed on 12th August 2014, working for the Salesians Province of New Delhi and putting the best effort to enhance the documentation system of YaR enters and services. HomeLink uses various tools to set up systematic documentation in the flowing five centers of Delhi Hub. Up till now, the nodes have been successful in capturing the data of more than 2,201 children and 670 plus services rendered to these children.

DON BOSCO ASHALAYAM, DELHI



Don Bosco Ashalayam is home of hope to provide an integrated life based on the right to survival, the right to development, the right to protection, the right to education, and the right to home for the children who are deprived, of all these basic needs. Today it caters to more than 5000 children through its street contact, shelter, vocational, and non-formal education programs. It has achieved a landmark for its work for the young at risk. Since its inception, the journey progressed and today, we find it is as an organization that heads a Children's Home, the Self-Reliance program, four- formal Education centers, a migrant desk for the youth, and three Childline in Delhi, which caters to the rehabilitation of Young at Risk.

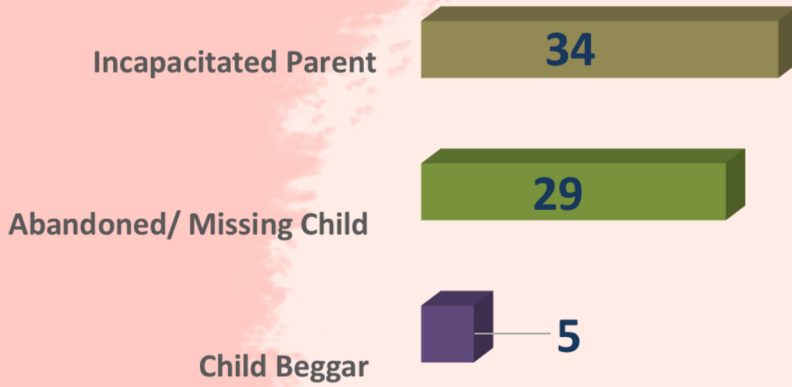
The Ministry of Women and Child Development has entrusted the responsibilities of running Childline service in the South West Delhi Zone of Delhi since its inception in 1998. Since its beginning, it has served 39215 children from 31 March- to 2022. In 2015 the Ministry offered two more Childline wings, Anand Vihar Railway Childline began in 2015 and reached 1766 children till 31 March 2022, and West Delhi Childline started in 2015 and received 5246 calls till 31 March 2022.

CHILDLINE- 1098 is an emergency helpline that integrates with outreach and rescue services for children in need of care and protection. It strives to be a referral network for providing emergency assistance to children around the country.

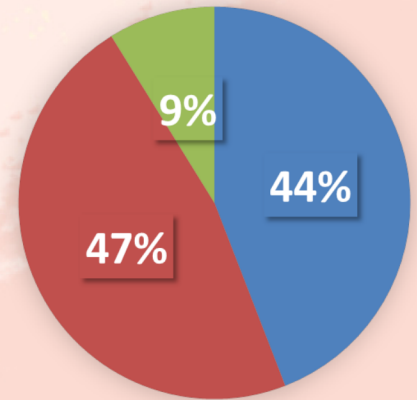
Ashalayam Delhi registered in Child MISS on 12- September 2014 and it has entered 1135 children's data, with 711 Calls and 244 services

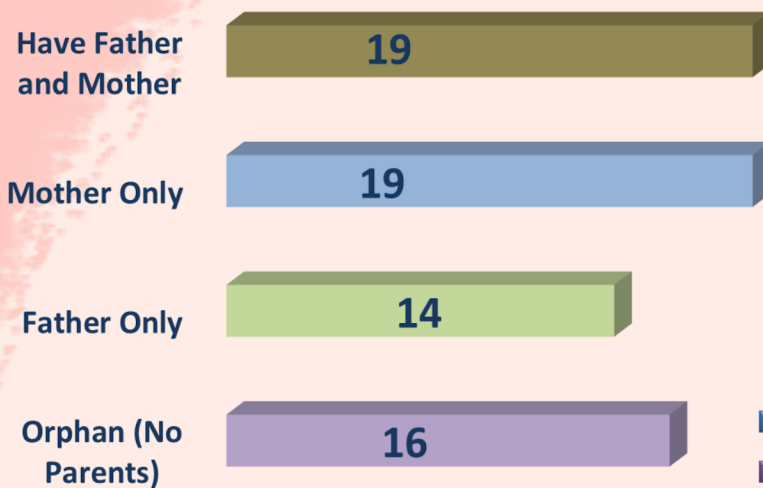

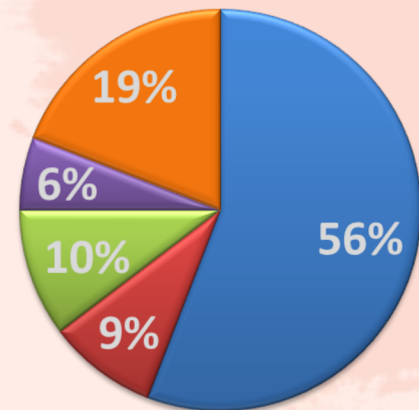

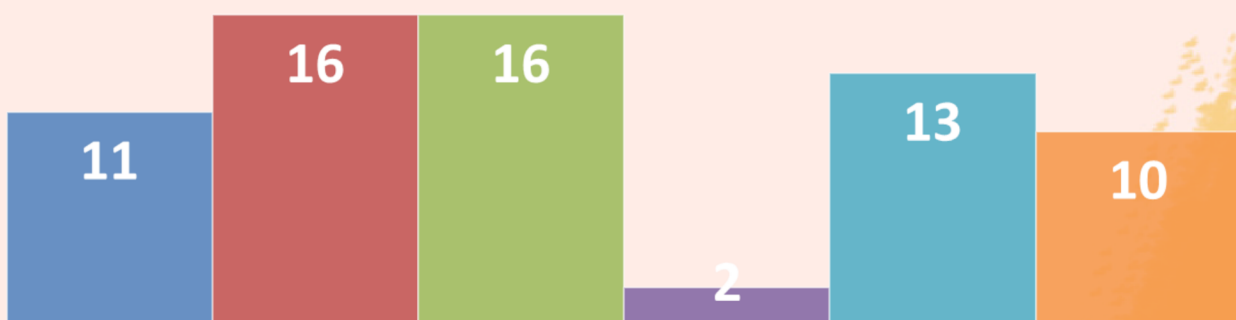

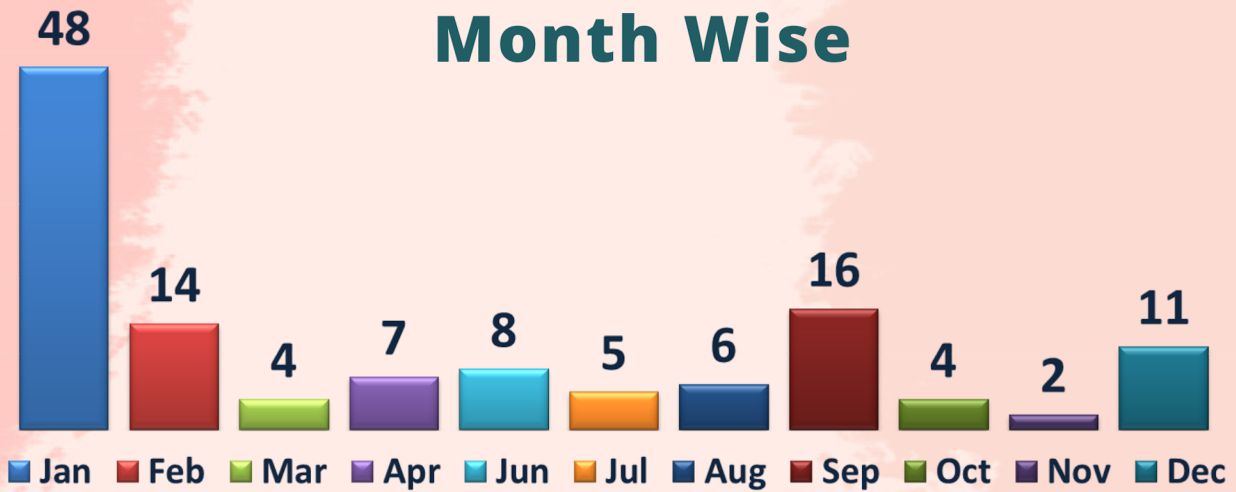

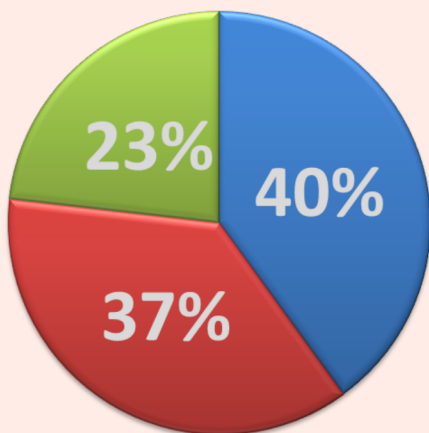

New Children Institutionalized Month Wise

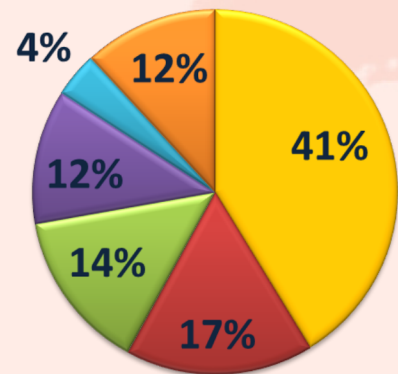

DON BOSCO ASHALAYAM, LUCKNOW

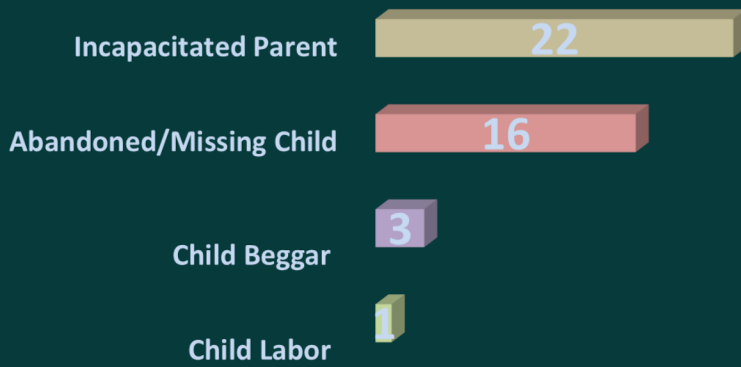


The YaR work began in Lucknow in the year 2002 at Hussainganj. It was called a 'Strangers Home'. This was the beginning of YaR's work in Lucknow. Don Bosco Ashalayam, Lucknow is a rehabilitation center for different categories of the Young at-Risk - street children, slum children, child laborers, etc.

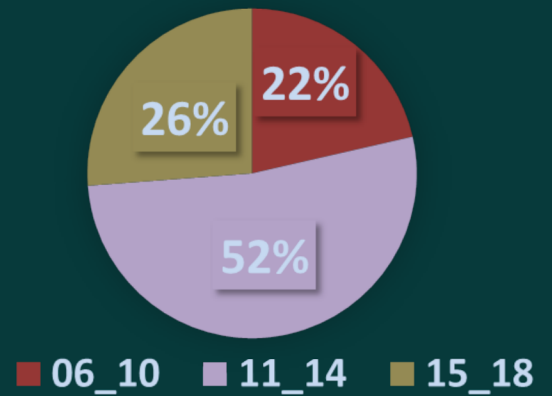
Don Bosco Ashalayam has a capacity for 50 children. From the beginning Ashalayam, Lucknow has been catered to more than 1000 children. It Reaches out to more than 1500 neglected children and youth per year through street contacts, rehabilitation, vocational, and educational (non-formal) programs. It has brought a smile to the face of many children due to the contribution of many people. Ashalayam Lucknow was registered in the Child MISS web portal on 1st- December 2018 and has been successful in capturing the services of 57 children in the shelter home.



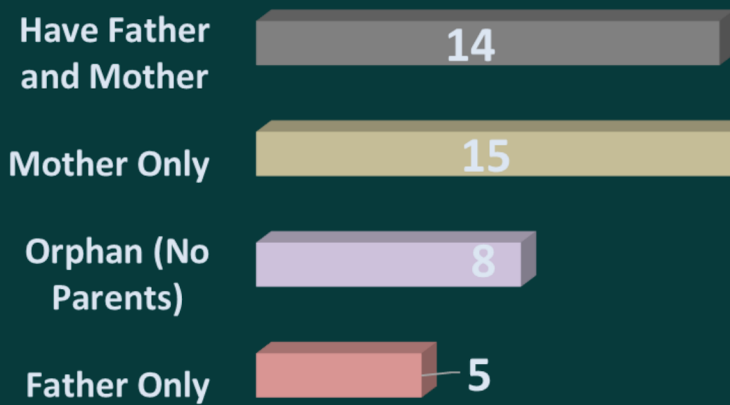

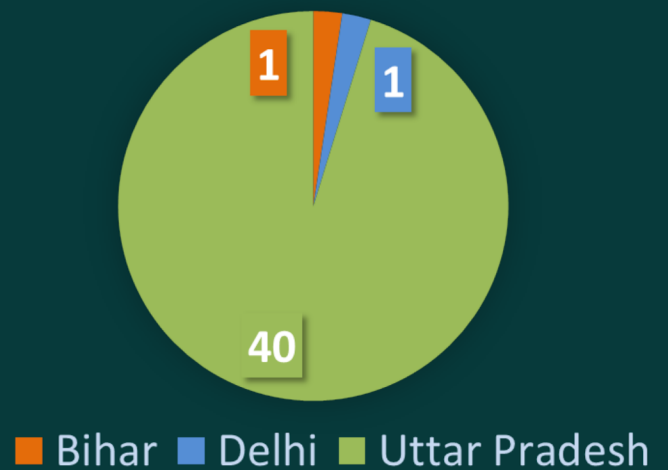
Age Analysis



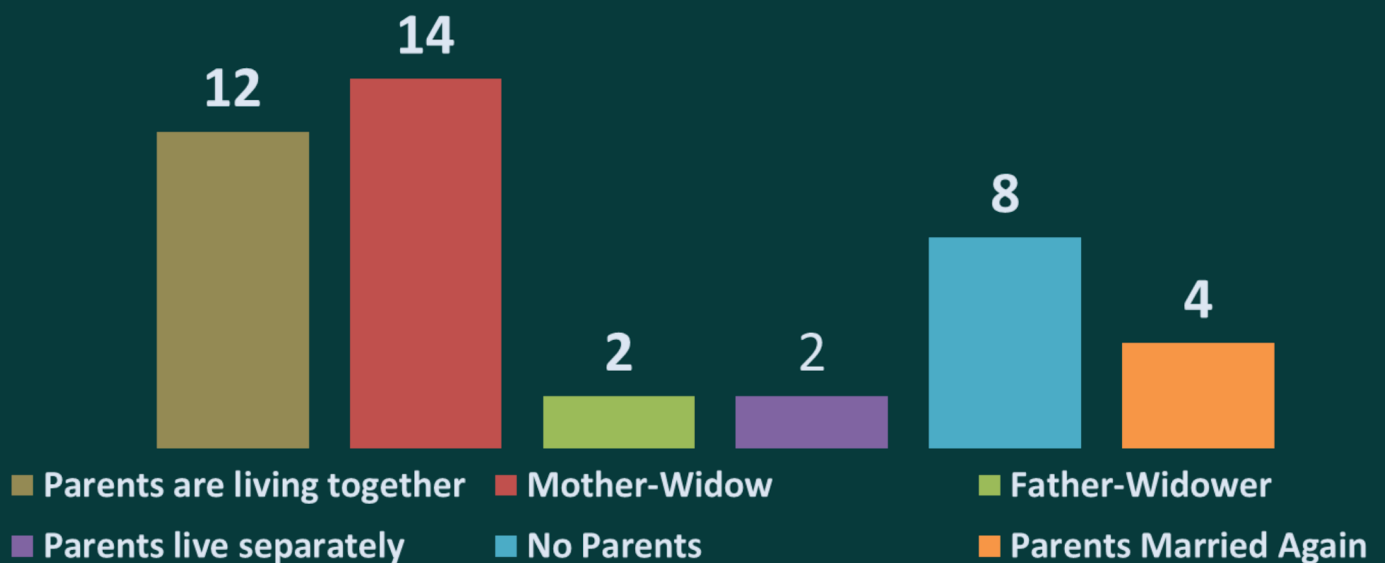
Parental Status

DON BOSCO NAVJEEVAN SOCIETY, CHANDIGARH

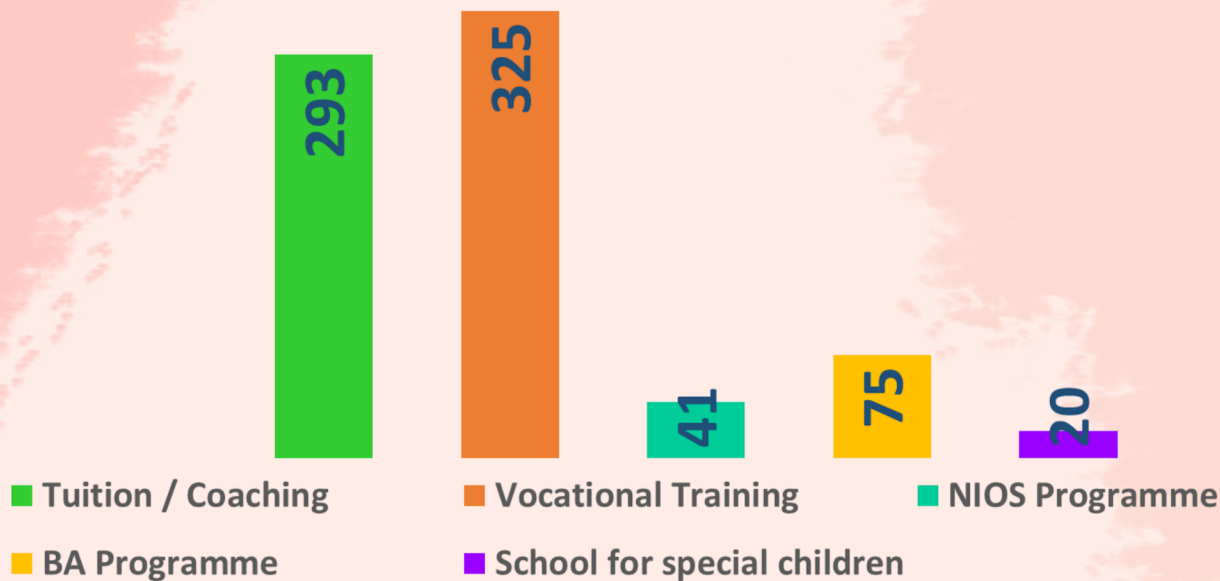


Don Bosco Navjeevan society is situated in Chandigarh. The center serves as an animation center for the Diocese, religion, and schools around. At present, the community has involved itself in looking after poor children and youth in slums and colonies. It has opened its doors to the neighborhood. Spoken English classes, Computer classes, Beautician courses, Tailoring courses, NIOS, and B.A. programs, are a few activities/interventions taken up by the organization.

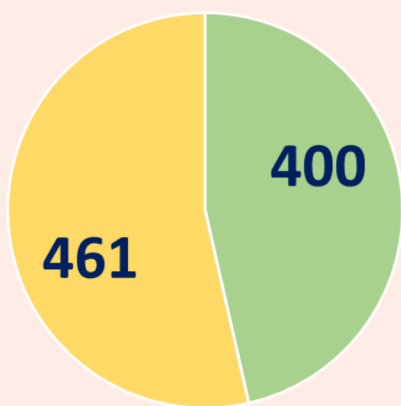
There are some centers in various slums and colonies where Balawadies and remedial classes are being run. In addition to this community runs a Day- Care center for special children in a rented house. Don Bosco Navjeevan created a huge impact and strong relationship with stakeholders in the city through the Child-Friendly City initiative Today community reaches out to more than 1000 children and 300 youth through its various programs. Navjeevan Chandigarh registered in Child MISS on 2nd- December 2013 and it has entered 719 children's data, and 338 services in the Child MISS tool.



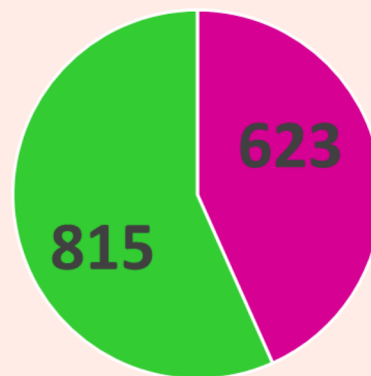
Children Benefited From Different Services



Women Benefited

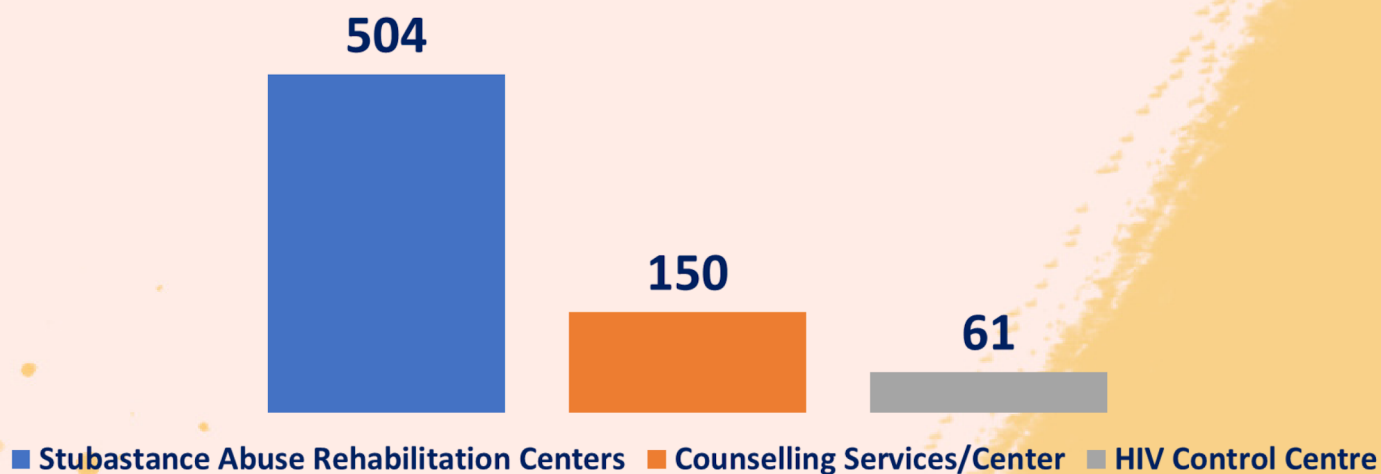


Child Parliament

DON BOSCO CENTRE, JHAJJAR

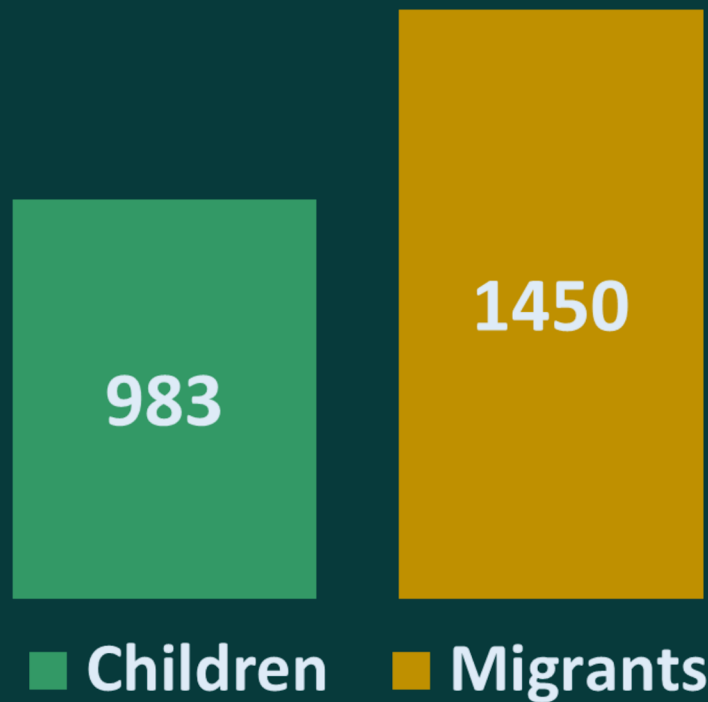


Don Bosco Pasaur Centre is located 32 km away from Don Bosco Ashalayam, Palam, and 10 km away from the Jhajjar District headquarters. The place is located with hundreds of brick factories in the vicinity. The center is catering to the children of migrants who come with families to earn their livelihood, especially from the states Bihar, West Bangle, and the few districts of Uttar Pradesh. The migrant workers come at the begging of September and work till the end of April or May. In the rainy season, Bhatta is set down as all the workers go back to their native village.

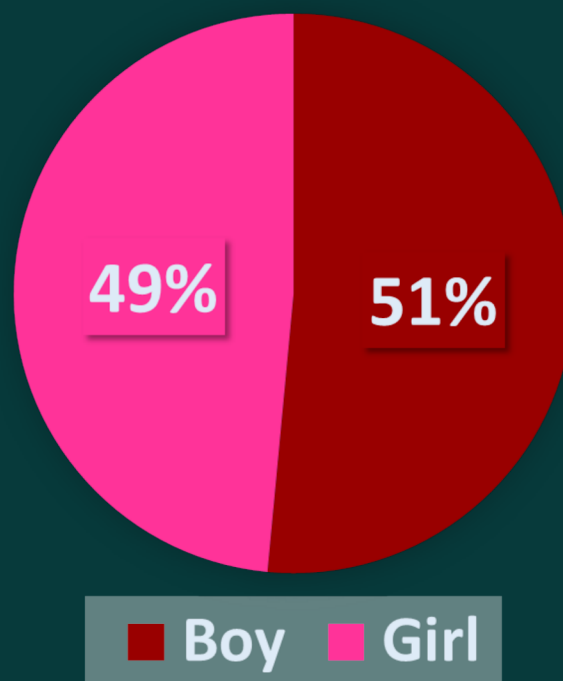
It provides Day Care to the children. Children are brought to the center by bus in the morning and they drop back at the Bhattas in the evening. Don Bosco Centre offers bridge schooling, mid-day meal, medical check-up, and organizing games and sports for the children. The Centre caters to around 400 to 500 children every year. The Centre Also provides a medical check for migrant workers and spread awareness among them. Don Bosco Jhajjar started the data entry in the Child MISS on 23rd November 2019 and it has entered 258 children's data.

HOLY CROSS SNEHALAYA, LUCKNOW



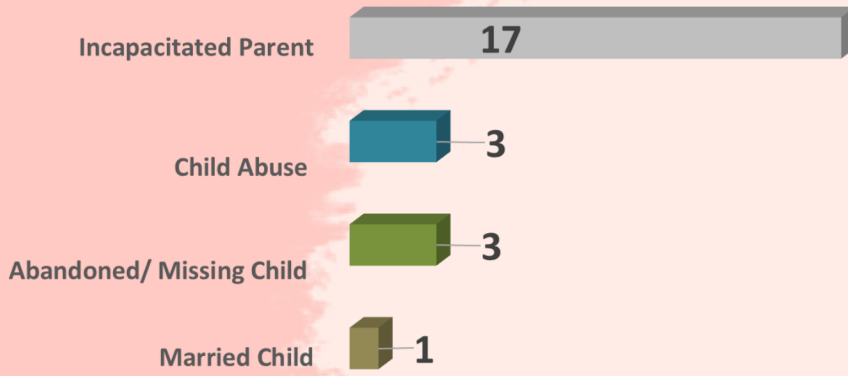
Snehalaya Lucknow is a Child Care Institute for girls run by Holy Cross Sisters. Located in Alambag Lucknow 3 KM away from Lucknow Railway station. Snehalaya offers the children, a home-like environment, and all the children are encouraged to attend formal schooling. Those with different aptitudes and abilities are allowed to attend non-formal education and skill training. The house has served 300 plus children who benefited through various services and programs. Now the capacity of the home is 25.

Children are also given ample opportunities to develop a holistic personality. Their inborn talents and potentials are identified and developed. Regular counseling and guidance are part of our lifestyle. Once a month, Parliament meetings enable them to be involved in the decision-making process. They are assisted in times of crisis to handle their individual and group problems and grow to have a positive outlook on life.

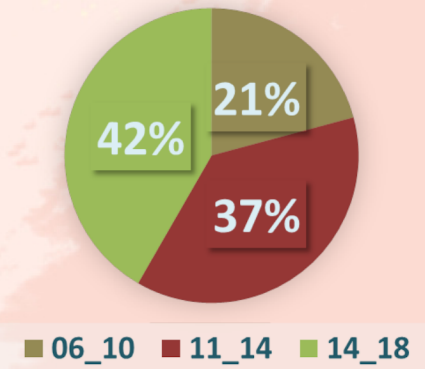
Snehalaya Lucknow began its journey with Child MISS on 13 January 2020 and it has entered 32 children's data and 24 Child Services in the tool.



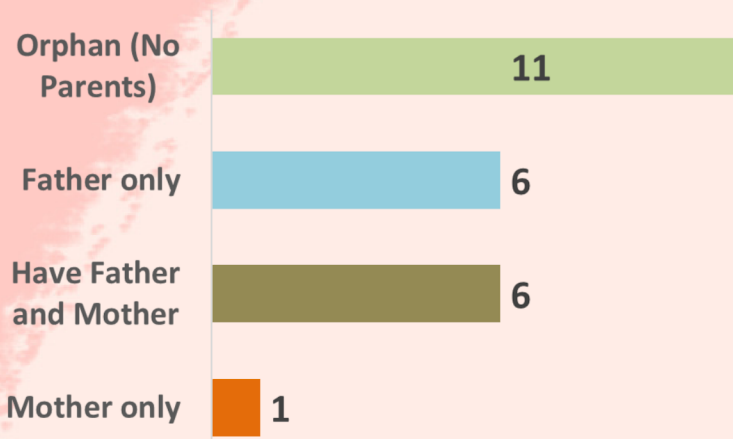

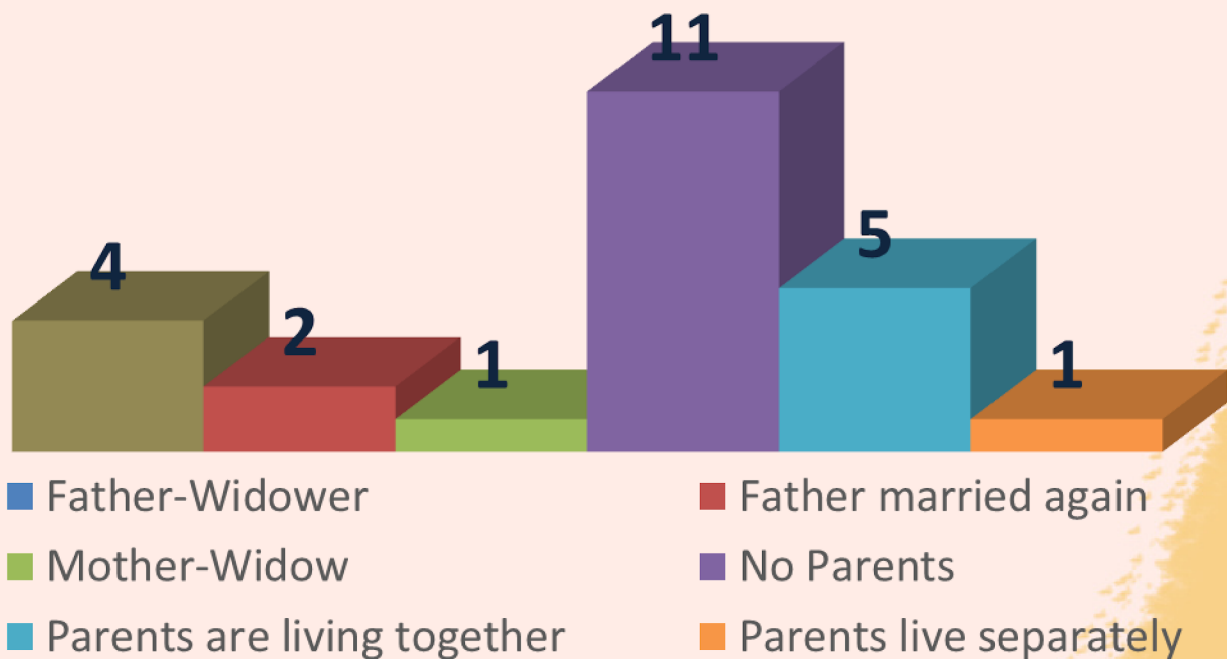

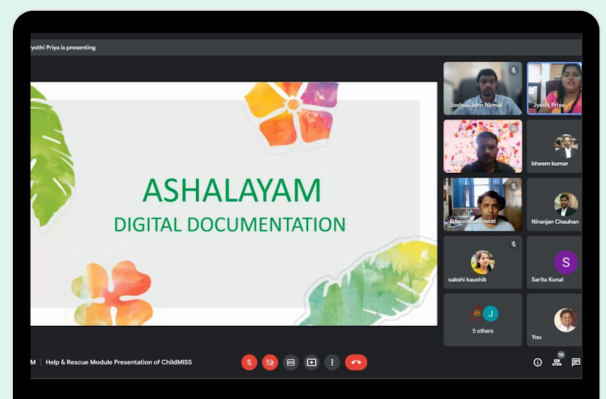
