


There is a saying "Today's Actions decide tomorrow's happenings". So let's do our best in action rather than in words and see better changes in the future.









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Status of Regional States




Child's Classification




It helps us to provide a clear view of the data that reflects the problems within specific categories in organizations to get solutions for the best interests of the children.














Visits & Hands-on Training

Visited DB Navjeevan-Hyderabad and gave hands-on training to 2 persons on the Child-MISS tool to update the child's profile data and all the registers.


Visited DB Navjeevan-Visakhapatnam to update the profiles of slum children, Vocational students and verified all child profiles & registers.





TRAINING ON POWER BI








