



The ultimate focus of child MISS is to create a '**Child Safety Net**', to say that child MISS is not a mere technological intervention or data collection software. It is vital information about the children in difficult circumstances, which will assist the networking organizations to strengthen the role of advocacy through legal provisions and law enforcement, review and reform child policy development, offer psychological counseling to children and parents, and raise the community consciousness and collaboration to create safe environment for children. Thus Homelink through network partners will promote safety and protection to children.



Nodes under INT hub were trained to build their capacity in utilizing the web tool as per their organization requirements and followed up for report Generation.







Pictorial representation of Data









Data Analysis 2021-2022

Age analysis of children below 18 years




Age analysis of beneficiaries above 18 years





Categories of Children below 18 years




Analysis on Child Abuse Types of Abuses

Relationship of Partner and their Age




The girl child is partnered majorly with their close relatives or distance relatives, same caste or same community is due to reasons like gender inequality, social norms, poverty, lack of education, safety concerns about girl children and control over sexuality. The graph shows 57% of partner's age is between 18-25, 40% of the partner's age is is between 26-35 and 6% falls between 36-46. The girls in the age group of 15 to 18 are also getting married on their own decision with their neighbours and friends due to love affairs.

Education for mental development, Medical help for the diseased and general health care and the visits are allowed by the parents/relatives and guardians to know the development status of their children. The above 18 categories are also served with life coping skills through various trades like Tailoring, Electrical & Plumbing, Garments, Computer Education, Bakery etc.,

"Everyone gets another chance to prove themselves and achieve success"

The boy Radha Krishnan is from a tribal family. He is a semi orphan child. His mother is a daily wage earner working under Mahatma Gandhi's 100 days work scheme. She sought the help of Don Bosco Anbu Illam for her son's higher secondary schooling. He was already given shelter in other NGOs. He came to Anbu Illam at the age of 15. His aim is to become a Doctor. So after completing his higher secondary education, he wrote NEET in the year 2020. He could not score as expected in his first attempt. He took special coaching with the help of Anbu Illam and appeared for NEET in the year 2021. He scored 406 in his second attempt.



Radhakrishnan got placement at Cuddalore Medical College Hospital and continuing his study.

The boy Ashwin, an orphan child was taken care of by his grandparents. since they were aged people, they saught shelter at Don Bosco Anbu Illam with the help of his school teacher. He joined Anbu Illam when he was in class VI. He was enrolled in english medium school. He scored good marks in class 10th. He achieved school first and his school honored him by gifting a Laptop for his studies. He completed his 12th standard in this academic year 2021-2022. He scored 514 out of 600 in his higher secondary board exam. We wish him all the best for his future career. His aim is to become a Doctor.

Story

"Where there is no Struggle there is no strength"

The boy Sivakumar, born in Coimbatore. Family members father and mother were seperated due to guarrel. His mother left the home along with 2 kids and went to to stay with her relative. His pollachi Mother was doing daily wage work. The relatives tortured the siblings a lot when they were in Pollachi. So the boy Siva kumar wanted to meet his father in Coimbatore. He convinced his brother and tried to run away from the home many times but failed. One day during the absence of his relatives they escaped from their relatives house and reached Coimbatore. As they were roaming on the roads of coimbatore in search of his father's residence, a Traffic police helped the boys and asked a truck man to take them and handover them at the police station. The police officials asked the boys which place they wanted to go and searched for their father and grandparents. As they were unable to find out the address, both were produced before Child Welfare Committee and given shelter at Don Bosco Anbu Illam in Coimbatore. They were given care and protection at Anbu Illam .The siblings were enrolled at School. Knowing this, his father came to meet the boys and took boy sivakumar with him to the place where he works and assured Anbu Illam management that he will take care of the boy. His brother continued his studies at Anbu illam.

The boy Siva kumar was physically abused with lot of domestic works given at the place where his father was working as daily wage earner. So he wanted to get back to anbu Illam. Telling his father about the abuse, he left the place and came back to anbu Illam . He was happily taken back by Anbu Illam management and staff and he was sent back to school to continue his Education. Since the boy was studying well, he was encouraged by the staff and Management in his studies. He was good in sports too. He was sent to Pastor Lenson Polytechnic College at kuthankully for completing his Diploma in mechanical engineering. After competing his studies he did many work and finally got opportunity to attend an interview conducted by L&T. He got through in the interview and joined as machine operator with an earning of 11000, with in a year he got promoted and earned Rs. 20000/-.During his career he had undergone many difficulties among the co-workers. So he was forced to resign the job from L& T. He did other kind of work to meet his expense. He got married and has a male kid. Now working in a pvt company earning more than 20000. He brough back his mother from his relatives house in pollachi with the help of Anbu Illam management and given shelter at "Thayagam", a home for women destitute . Now he is happy living with his family, mother and brother.



Story

" Small opportunities are often the beginning of great achievements "

14 - year - old boy Anandha Jothi is a slow learner and he belongs to a broken family, when he was at the age of three his father and mother were separated from each other due to some misunderstanding. Then Anandha Jothi began to live with his father and her mother went to her native with her another boy baby. Now Anandha Jothi was in the care of his father and grandmother, Anandha Jothi's father was working as a coolie in order to keep his son good and support him for his studies.

The father enrolled the son in a nearbu government elementaru school in Kanoorpudur village. However, there is no support for Anandha Jothi to take care of him at home after school, especially to support and help to complete his home works. Only his grandmother used to be at his side. In this case, he had the opportunity to join Marialaya evening class when he was in class third. After he joined the evening class our teachers found that he had a great interest in studies but he did not have the ability to understand and read properly. He did not have the ability to understand mathematics and English, after that he was given special training on a daily basis with the help of an evening coaching teacher. Seeing that his learning ability increased in just two months after joining our center, Anandha Jothi 's school teacher called our evening teacher and complimented her greatly. After that, the tutor of Marialaya focused even more and tried to bring Anandha Jothi as a best boy.

It was also a rare opportunity for the boy as he continued to focus not only on education but also on other social work in our evening class. He was very passionate about social work. He also became a member of the Children's Parliament in our evening class and won the election and became the minister of sports, his passion for sports made him a minister. He then obtained play equipment from Marialaya and kept it in the evening class to keep the other children interested and engaged in games and sports. At the same time he did well in his schooling and made good progress. Anandha Jothi, who initially got only 30 per cent marks, is now getting 90 per cent marks in Mathematics and English in his seventh standard academic year, Marialaya's evening class was a boon to Anandha Jothi's unsupported family environment and was a major milestone in his academic journey. At present, our Anandha Jothi is not only a great student in sports, education and social work but also a great man, now he became a role model in the village for other children.

Concluding words from the Hub Coordinator

There was a mounting risk of violence, exploitation, and abuse during this pandemic, The closure of school and usage of smartphones misleads many children towards behavioural problems. The children are abused by their neighbours, relatives, and even parents. Many parents are forced to arrange for child marriages due to poverty, loss of parents, love affairs, etc. The analysis report shows that the organisation rescues many categories of children to protect them from all forms of abuses. More than 75 % of the children who fall under the age group of 11 to 18 are affected due to a lack of parental care. Such analysis helps in finding out the reason for child vulnerability and the strategies to overcome such issues.

Digital transformation in documentation takes our organisation to next level. To do this we need a sophisticated tool to store our documents. The YaR forum India, introduced "Child MISS, a web tool to document all the information about the children and the services provided for the development of children.

With the help of this tool, INT HUB analysed a few issues of the children and presented it graphically in this Annual Report of 2021-2022, which helps the readers know about our services to Children.
