


Hub Coordinator's Message





There are Six Nodes under Chennai Hub. Node visits are done after an appointment fixed on monthly basis. Below are several major points addressed during the visits. These points include:

Major Events



Digital Transformation and Innovation Training

Don Bosco National Forum for the Young at Risk organized an advanced training program on Digital Transformation and Innovation in social media for NGOs in New Delhi between 4th and 7th of May 2022. 11 Salesian Provinces participated in the training, indicating a widespread interest in digital transformation among the organization's branches. Training session emphasized the importance of proper digitalized documentation, highlighting the need for efficient and organized record-keeping. Representatives from Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Coimbatore, and Delhi Provinces received the Child People's Protection kit. Training program also involved distributing resources to facilitate the implementation of child protection measures. Hub team expressed their gratitude to the National office and resource persons for their contributions and initiatives in making the training program successful.



INM - YaR Commission Meeting

INM - YaR Commission meetings were held twice a year, with two different venues: Don Bosco Animation Center in Ennore and at DBICA, Provincial House. These meetings focus on evaluating the progress and formulating future strategies for these centers. During the meeting, a presentation on Homelink - Child MISS (Missing in Social Services) reports was given. Indicating a regular schedule for gathering and discussing matters related to the YaR Centers.

Fr. Joe Prabu, who presumably chaired the meeting, introduced the commission members and welcomed new members. The new members included Fr. Andrews Stephen Raj, Fr. Siluvai Muthu, and Mrs. Jyothi Priya. INM - YaR Commission meeting, indicating discussions on the status of YaR Centers, presentation of reports and the commission's activities.



Homelink Training Programme

Homelink Training program took place on 4th of July 2022 at the Provincial House. 18 participants attended the training, suggesting a significant level of engagement and interest in the Homelink program. Informative posters on YaR definition and

Child Protection Policy were released during the training. These posters serve as visual aids to raise awareness and provide guidance on the respective topics.

Rev. Fr. Edwin Vasanth, INM Economist released the 2021 – 2022 Annual Report. Which highlighted the overview of the activities, achievements, and Statistics of Chennai Hub of the reporting year.

During the GaP (Gap analysis) and Node action plan were discussed and formulated. GaP analysis likely involved identifying areas of improvement or gaps in the reports, while the Node action plan outlined specific steps and objectives for each Node. The training lasted for a full day, indicating an intensive and comprehensive session.



Campaign for Cause

Online launch of the National YaR Campaign 2022-2023 took place on 31st August 2022. The theme of the campaign was “Choose life, Not Drugs.” This theme focused on raising awareness on dangerous effects of drugs and promoting a healthy and drug-free lifestyle among young people. Special invitees were briefed about the significance and objectives of the campaign. Campaign Posters were released simultaneously across India to create a visual impact and reach a wider audience children from INM YaR Centers and Services participated and understood the highlights of the campaign.



Hostel Act Trainings to NGOs

Trainings focused on the Hostel Act, POCSO Act, and Juvenile Justice Act 2015, as well as the procedures documentation. The trainings were specifically delivered to NGOs within the Chennai Hub, indicating a targeted effort to strengthen their understanding and implementation of relevant legal frameworks and documentation practices. A total of approximately 150 participants from different organizations took part in the trainings. By providing these trainings, valuable knowledge and guidance were shared with the participating NGOs, empowering them to ensure compliance with relevant acts and establish effective documentation systems. As a result of the trainings, eight organizations successfully registered and received a Hostel Acts certificate.



Don Bosco Standards of Care Training Programme



Training organized by the DB YaR National Forum and headed by Fr. Tony and his team, took place on 25th January 2023 at Bosco Illam. Directors and Coordinators from various YaR centers in Chennai and Trichy Province participated in the program.

Primary objective of the training was to equip the Directors and Coordinators with the necessary knowledge and skills to maintain systematic documentation. This training specifically focused on the importance of reporting and documentation, emphasizing accurate and thorough record-keeping for the purpose of providing quality care and monitoring the progress and well-being of the young people in their respective organizations.

Young at Risk (YaR) day celebration at Chennai Province

INM Young at Risk Commission organized YaR Day 2023 at Don Bosco Beatitudes in Vyasarpadi, Chennai. The event focused on the theme “Choose Life Not Drugs.” A total of 317 children and staff members from 7 YaR Centers and Service Centers participated in the celebration. Chief Guest for the event was Fr. Don Bosco, INM Provincial who delivered the Presidential address to the young people. He encouraged them to stay focused in life and make positive choices. Fr. Joseph Leo, Provincial Council Incharge, and other YaR Centre directors were also present in the program.



Competitions were organized as part of the YaR Day celebration. Don Bosco Beatitudes secured the First prize, followed by Pope John’s Garden in second place, and Don Bosco Jawadhi Hills in third place. DBAI - Saranalayam received the Overall Discipline Group award, recognizing their commitment to maintaining discipline throughout the event. Additionally, prizes of appreciation were awarded to the best students from the 10th and 12th classes. These prizes aimed to recognize and encourage academic achievements among the young participants.

The YaR Day celebration provided a platform for young at-risk individuals to showcase their talents, learn about making positive life choices, and receive recognition for their achievements. The highlight of the day was the magic show presented by Mr. Vasudevan.







Snippets

This initiative involves the analysis of statistical data, particularly focusing on children in Child Care Institutions and Street Presences. The statistical data is derived from the Child Management Information System and Services (Child MISS) tool of the Homelink Network. Through the Data Speaks initiative, snippets of this statistical data are published, aiming to create awareness and visibility of the work being done for young people in Chennai hub. These snippets provide key insights and highlight important trends or issues related to the well-being and support of vulnerable children.

INM Province has released 18 Hub JPEG snippets and 6 Video snippets and 04 node level snippets successfully. Here are the few highlighted snippets for your glance.





Flipbook

Flipbooks were specifically developed to cater to readers' shorter attention spans, offering basic information presented in a visually appealing format on mobile devices. They strike a balance



between concise content and visual engagement, enabling readers to access information efficiently while still having the option to explore further through external links. Chennai and Guwahati Hubs prepared a flipbook on 'After Care Program'.

After Care programme is necessary for the young person in need of care and protection or the young person who has been involved in conflict with the law who requires further assistance for completion of the process of Rehabilitation or Attainment of self-sufficiency on his/her release from the Juvenile Justice Home.

Aftercare is a mission towards the enhancement of young adults by providing care, protection and skills development. The initiative focuses on supporting the care leavers to have an Independent and Self-dependent life. After Care helps the young adults to gain skills to increase the possibilities of survival.

Mini Research

“Incapacitated parent of children in institutional care”

This study is taken to analyze, interpret and reflect on Incapacitated Parents not by excluding any conditions but by seeing from a holistic perspective. This study reveals the fact that Institutions play a vital role in shaping the lives of children. Sometimes we fail to focus on children coming from families with single parents, and we may give serious attention only to orphans. Since many of the parents are incapacitated, their children's cases should be studied in depth and recommended for institutional care or family/community-based care.

He bagged the trophy in the (RDS) Republic Day Sports and qualified for (BDS) and won the Gold medal in state-level Bharathiyar Day Sports for below 46 kg category. In 2023, he won Gold medal in State Boxing Championship for Youth Men 46 – 48 weight category and he is qualified to the Nationals.
