

Homelink Network

The HomeLink Network is a continuous project initiated by DB YaR Forum in 2002 to provide an accurate and timely response to the needs of at-risk youth. It aims to establish a culture of data-led management and intervention planning supported by technology. The project facilitates real-time monitoring and predictive intervention planning, enabling organizations to respond effectively to evolving scenarios of young people at risk.

The HomeLink Network spans across India with 8 Hubs and multiple Nodes. The Network comprises over 93 member organizations, interconnected through the Child MISS web tool which contains data of over 346,242 children. The tool has facilitated the restoration and home placement of over 121,220 children. Between January 2013 and March 2023, 116,260 children's details have been recorded in the Child MISS tool, of which 69,901 have been restored to their families or guardians.





Child MISS

Child MISS is a Management Information System and Services and a network that contributes to speed, process, structure, knowledge, and services for the care, protection, and development of children. It is a web-based tool, to assist government and non-governmental organizations in documenting all their services and follow up in a single-window system to enhance their mission for children at risk more effectively and efficiently.


The ultimate focus of Child MISS is to create a **'Child Safety Net'**, to say that Child MISS is not a mere technological intervention or data collection software. It is vital information about the children in difficult circumstances, which will assist the networking organizations to strengthen the role of advocacy through legal provisions and law enforcement, review and reform child policy development, offer psychological counselling to children and parents, and raise the community consciousness and collaboration to create a safe environment for children. Thus Homelink through network partners will promote safety and protection to children.

Training on Social Audit




Hub Monthly & Weekly Meetings


Other Activities








Training for New Hub Coordinators

Story from Don Bosco Anbu Illam - Coimbatore

The boy comes from a deserving family, with his father working as a cook at Salem Anbu Illam and his mother selling food on the pavement. He has an older sister and a younger brother. He attended school at Salem Don Bosco Anbu Illam. As he desired to pursue higher studies, the director of Anbu Illam helped him secure sponsors and transferred him to Don Bosco Anbu Illam in Coimbatore. He completed his engineering course at JCT College of Engineering and Technology. However, he faced difficulties in college as before he studied in Tamil medium and a lack of interest, resulting in irregular attendance. With guidance from Anbu Illam management, he managed to complete his degree. In order to support his financially struggling family, he took up a job as a sales executive in a lifestyle showroom, earning a salary of Rs. 7500. However, this was not enough to help his family, so he left the job and found another one as a salesman in a textile company in 2017, earning Rs. 10500. Due to his performance and dedication, he was promoted to sales manager for a new branch of the company. In 2020, Fr. Ryan, the director of Anbu Illam, referred him to Mr. Prasanna, a member of the MAD Group who started a bread making company. He was hired as the store incharge and successfully increased the company's sales from 2 lakhs to 8.5 lakhs within one year. He is now the manager of one of the company's branches, earning Rs. 30000 per month. He has also provided job opportunities for other shelter home boys who have completed their studies. He expresses gratitude towards Fr. Ryan and the staff for their encouragement and support.

Story from Don Bosco Anbu Illam- Salem

My name is Kiran and I come from a difficult background. I lost my parents at a young age and my family was unable to support my education. Thankfully, I was taken in by Don Bosco Anbu Illam, where I received shelter and education until the 11th standard. Initially, I didn't show much interest in my studies, but thanks to the motivation and support from the staff and teachers at the shelter home, I was able to complete my 10th standard. However, I didn't have any plans for further education at that time. Eventually, I decided to join a government ITI (Industrial Training Institute), but unfortunately, I couldn't find a placement. With the help and effort of Anbu Illam, I was able to secure a place in an ITI and successfully completed my training. Following that, I attended a campus interview and was fortunate enough to get a job at a Royal Enfield showroom. This opportunity at Don Bosco Anbu Illam has truly changed my life. Over the past 10 years, I have not only received shelter and education, but I have also had the chance to develop my talents in various areas such as studying, playing, and dancing. I have made many friends and have grown into a better person because of the support and guidance from the former and current directors, fathers, staff members, and fellow students at Don Bosco Anbu Illam. I am eternally grateful for their help and will always cherish the positive impact they have had on my life.

Story from Don Bosco Nest - Tiruppur

"My aim is to become a motor mechanic." This was the dream of Senthil Kumar, a 16-year-old boy from an economically poor background. Unfortunately, his father became paralyzed due to illness, leaving his mother as the sole breadwinner for the family. They struggled to meet their basic needs, and Senthil had to discontinue his studies due to poverty.

Without any direction or support, Senthil fell into addiction and became a burden on his family. However, one of our past pupils referred him to Don Bosco Nest for counseling and guidance. It was there that he found hope and decided to join a vocational training course.

Senthil chose to study electrician course and dedicated himself to learning the skills required. He completed the exams conducted by the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and also passed his 10th standard board exams. With newfound confidence, he now wants to continue his technical education to become a mechanic.

Not only has Senthil made progress in his education, but he is also overcoming his addiction to drugs. He now believes that he can achieve his dreams and is determined to work hard. Don Bosco Nest has provided him with the necessary support and guidance to turn his life around, and he is grateful for the opportunity.
