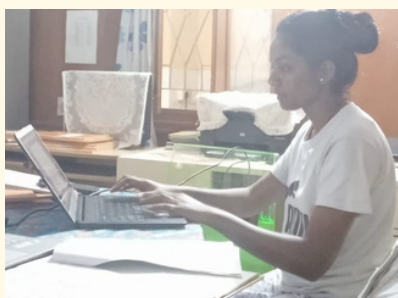

Ms. Albina Dungdung is a vital data operator in Jyoti Snehalaya. Her responsibilities include record-keeping, updating activities, and supporting children in important area such as CWC, healthcare, education and extracurricular activities.



Ms. Jane and Mr. Hari are case worker and data operator of Carmel Jyoti Children Home in Manipur. They provide care, support and engage in cocurricular activities with children in separated boys and girls' home.

At Snehalaya Boys Home, Mr. Deepjyoti serves as a caretaker and case worker. He focuses on the holistic development of children, manages cases, handles educational matters and performs data entry using child MISS tools.



Ms. Shilpa is a versatile staff member at Auxilium Snehalaya-Child Care Institution. She serves as a data operator, case worker and caretaker, responsible for maintaining activity records, data entry and following up on children's cases with government departments and the CWC.

DATA MANAGER-JOB ROLE



At Rilang Childrens' home, Ms. Christine plays a dual role as data operator and counselor. She provides essential support to children with mental health concerns, and updates child details on the web portal and maintains records of CWC cases and the organization provided services.

At Ila Snehalaya Betkuchi, Sr. Merida assumes multiple roles. She manages documentation, support the superintendent, teaches songs, dance, English and good manners to the children. Additionally, she serves as a dedicated case worker of their development and well-being.



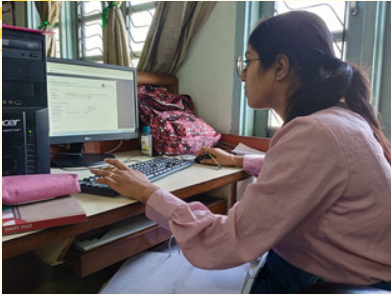

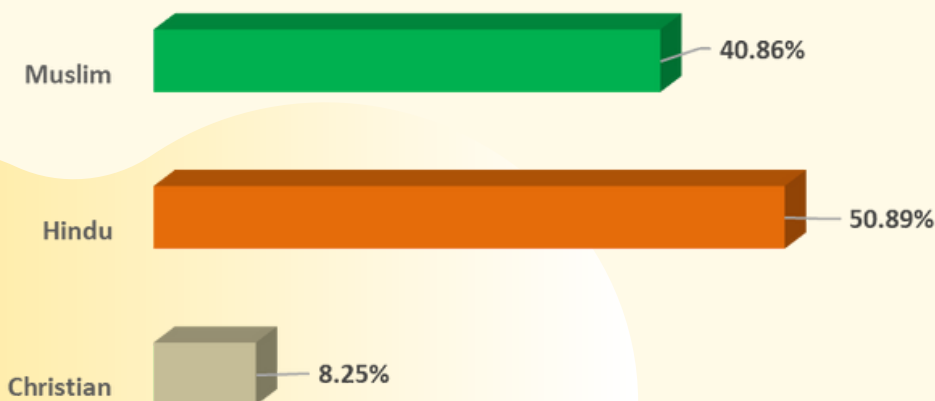

Parental Status

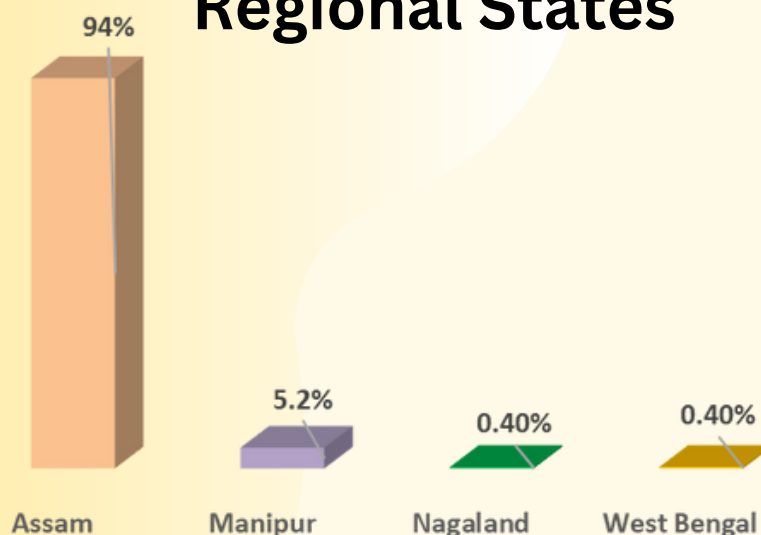

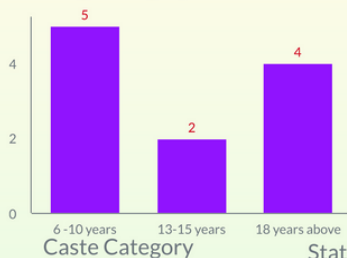

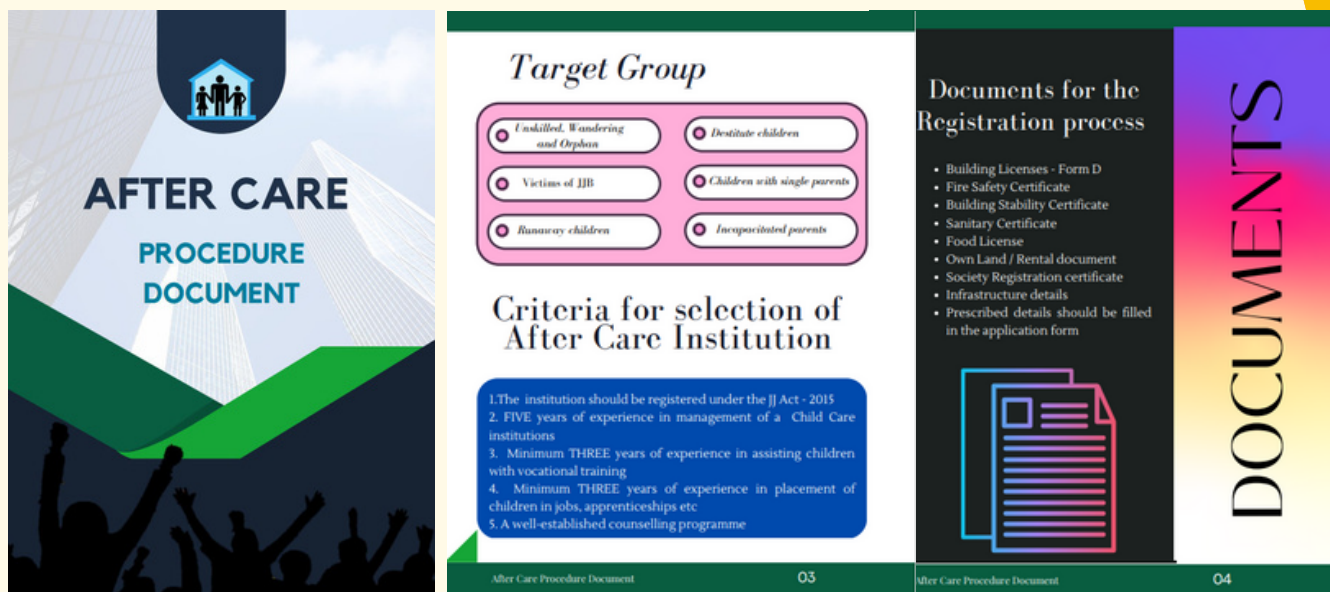
FLOW CHARTS

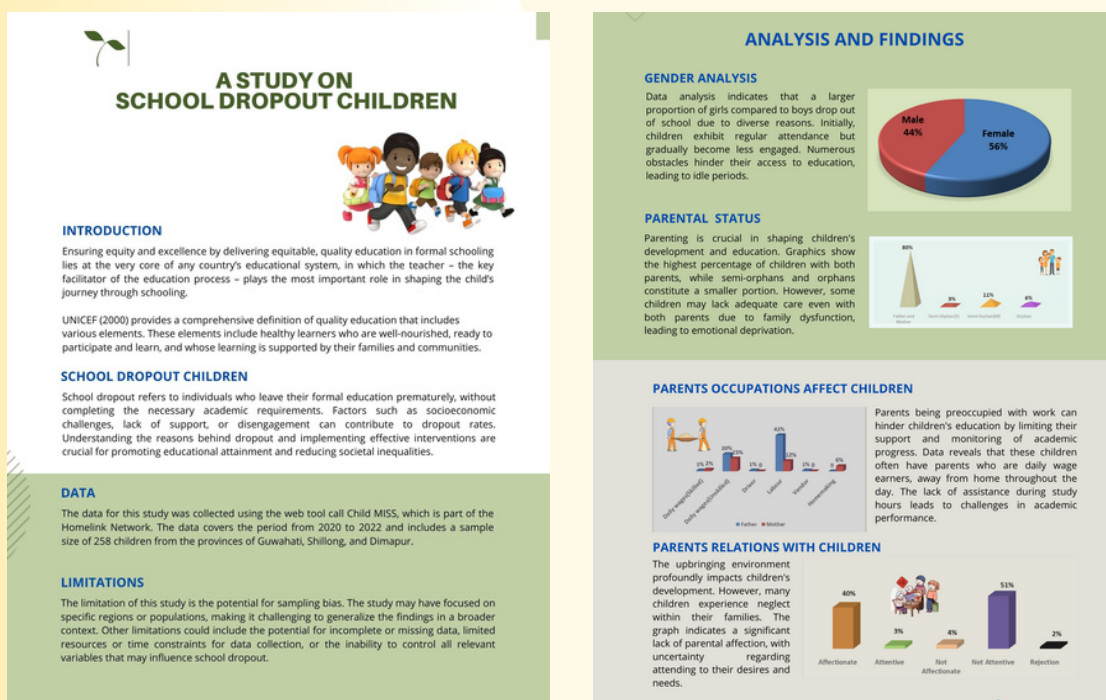
Flipbook
