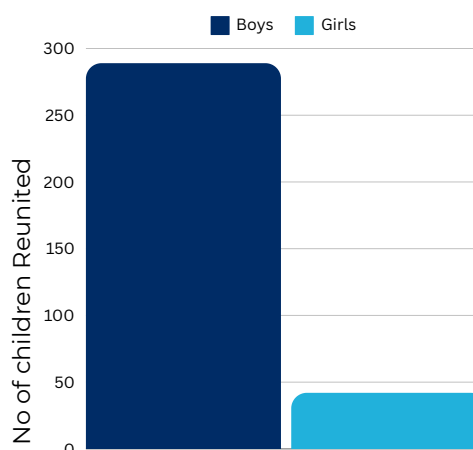

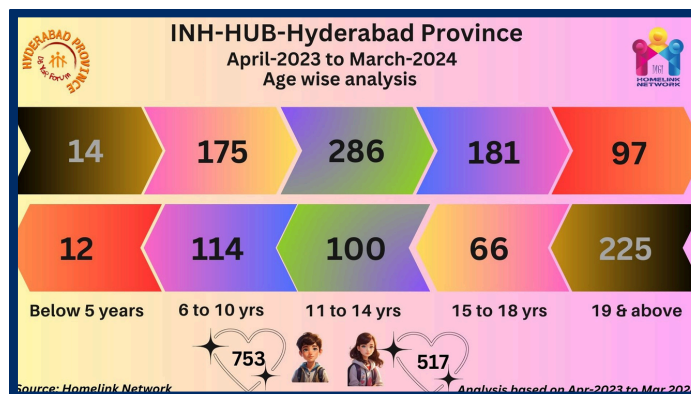

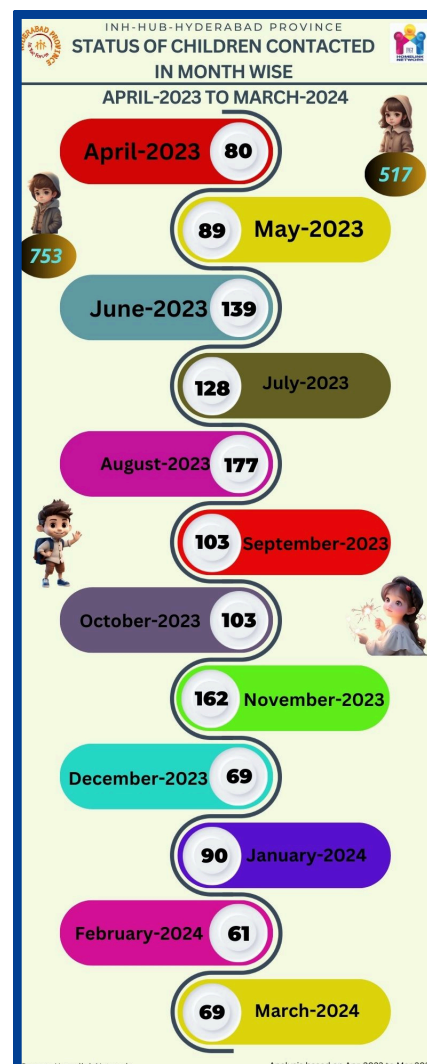
## Representation of organization wise details



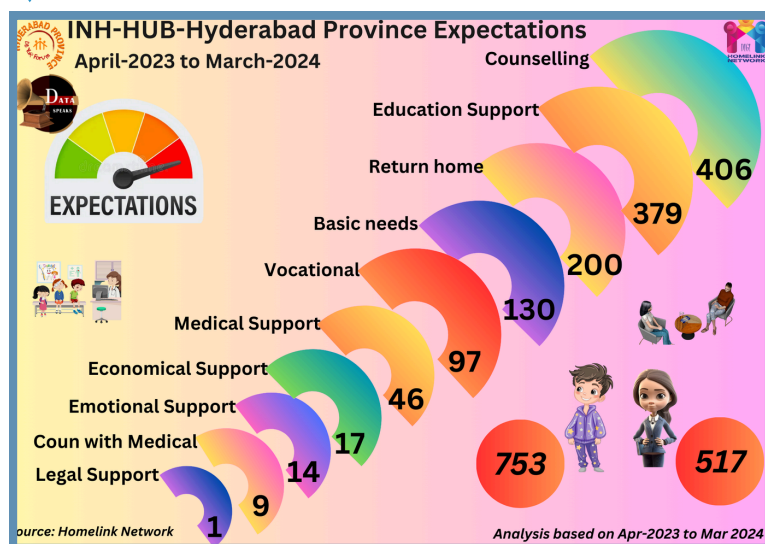
## Representation of Age Wise details

## Representation of Expectations wise details

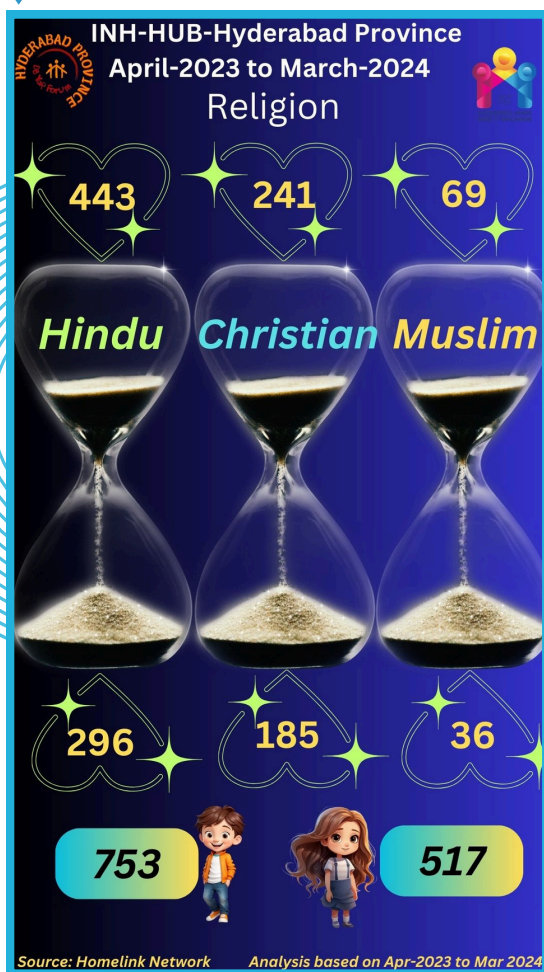

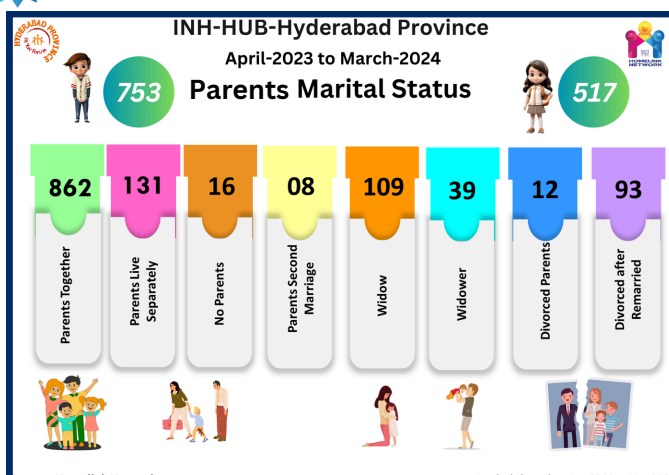
## Representation of Religion wise details



## Representation of Contact Area wise details



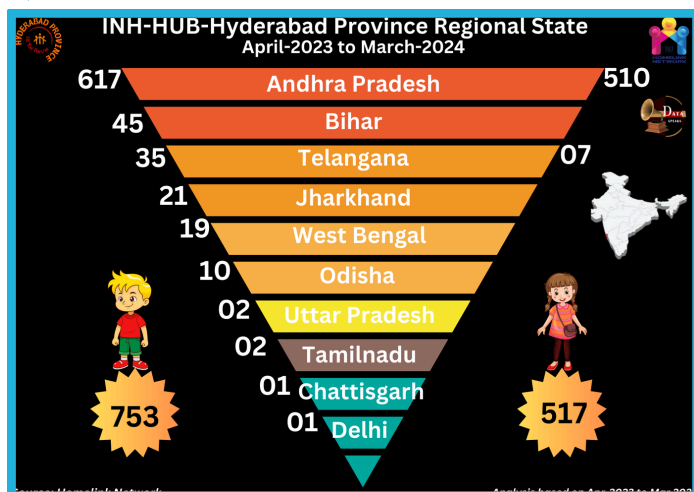
## Representation of Parents Marital Status



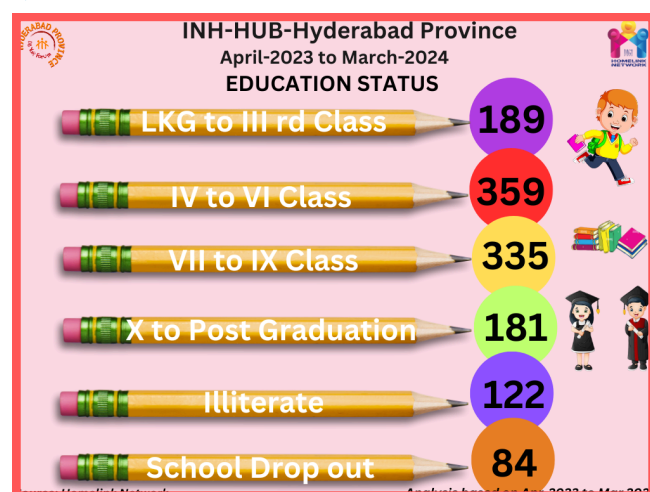

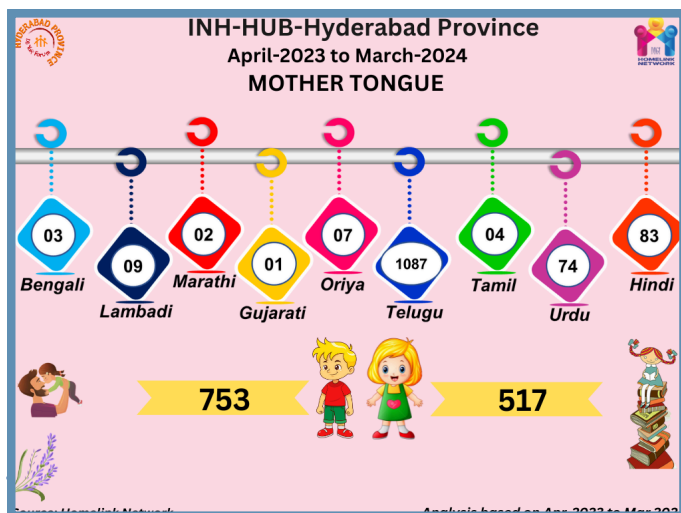
## Representation of State Wise details

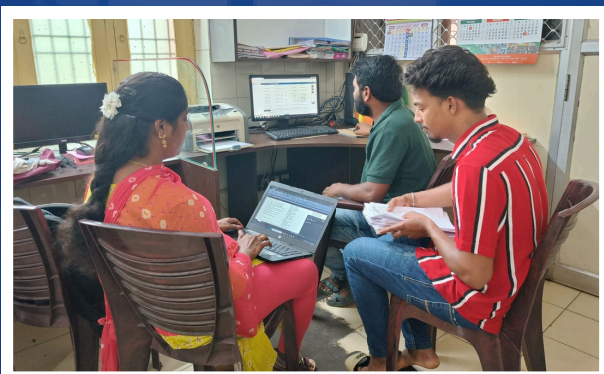




# ACTIVITIES

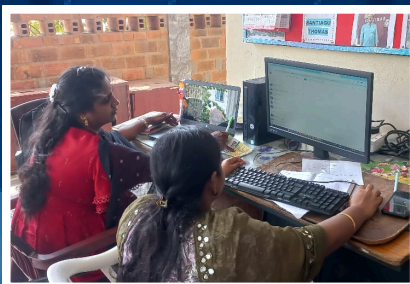
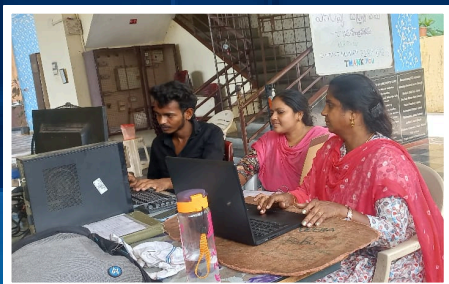

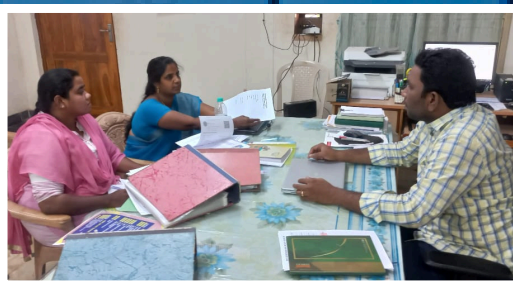
## NODE VISITS IN OUR PROVINCE

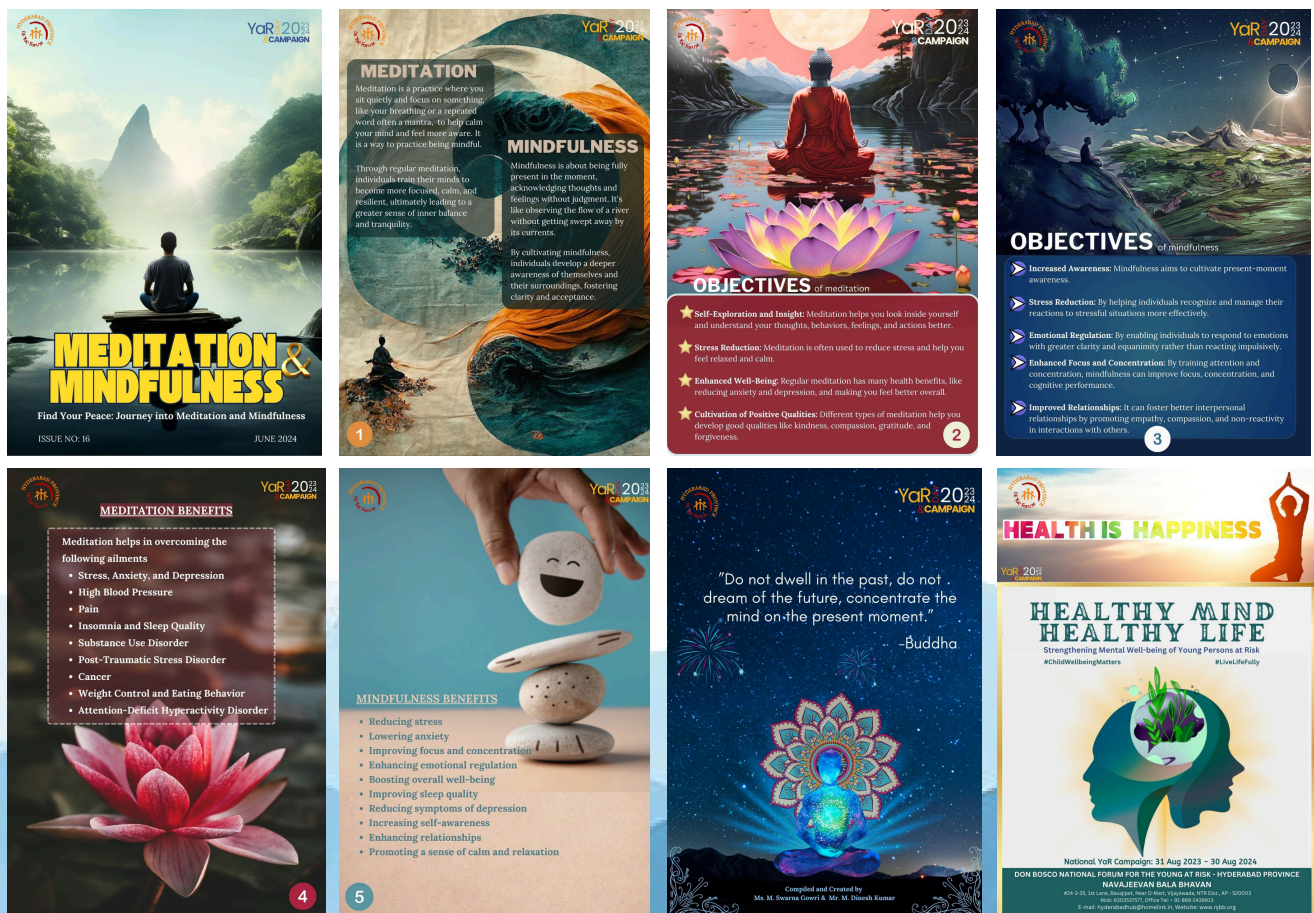


# FLIPBOOK

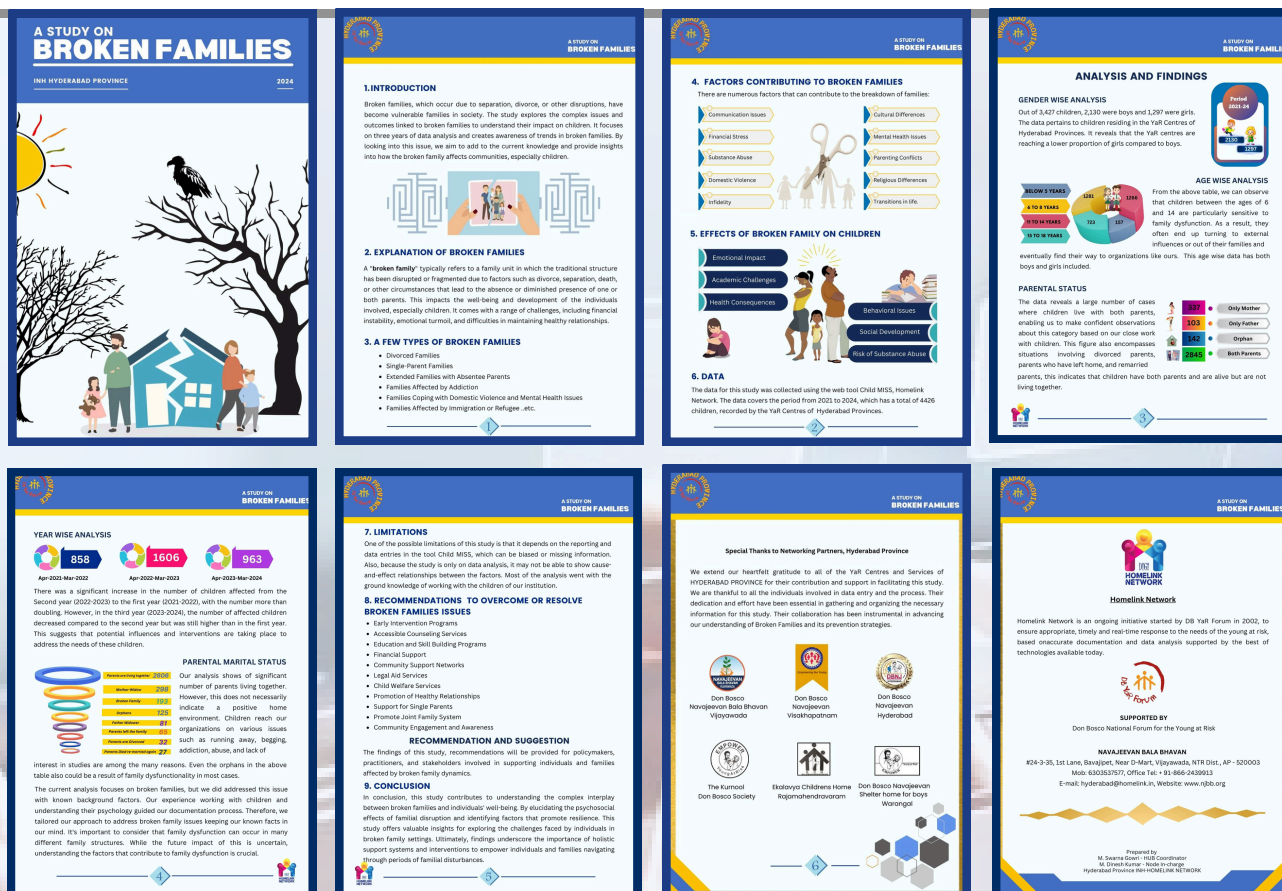

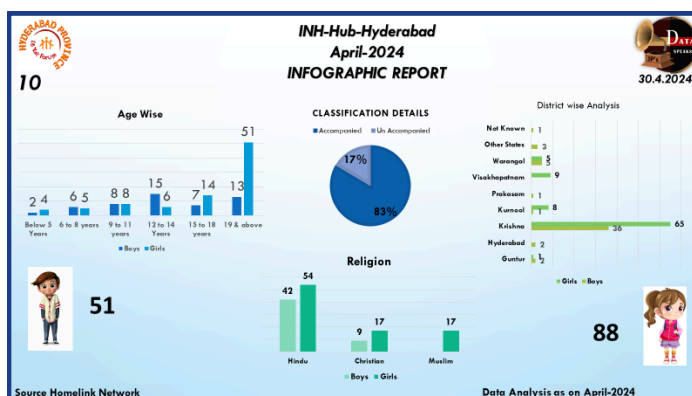
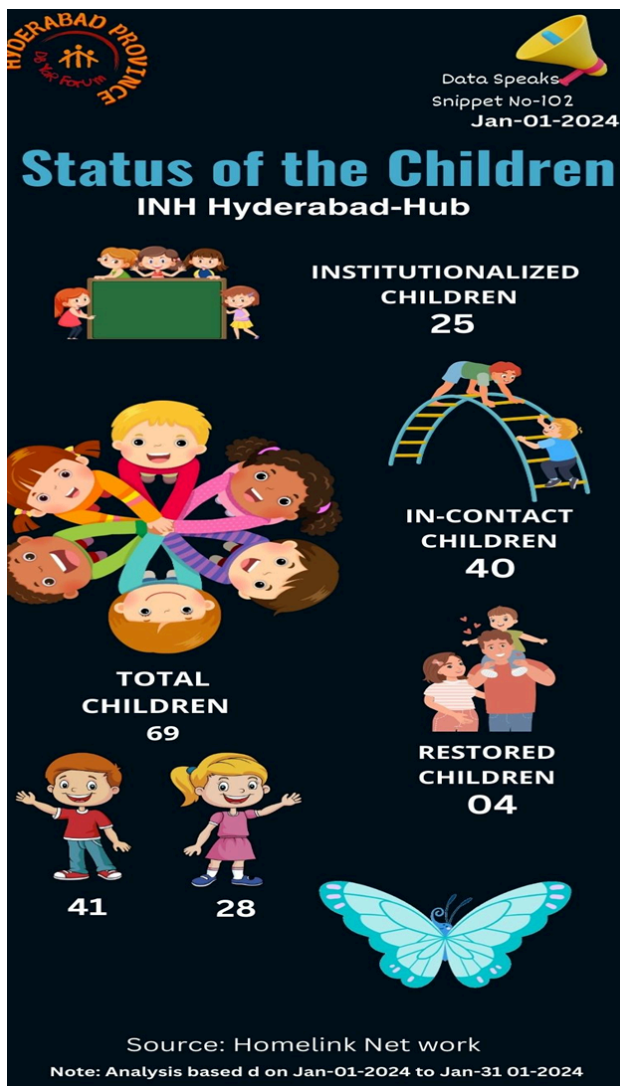
## BROKEN FAMILIES

For the study, data was obtained from Child MISS for the three years from 2020 to 2023. This data was then analyzed to identify patterns and trends related to issues of broken families and their critical problems. The insights gained from this study help us develop better strategies to support children and families.



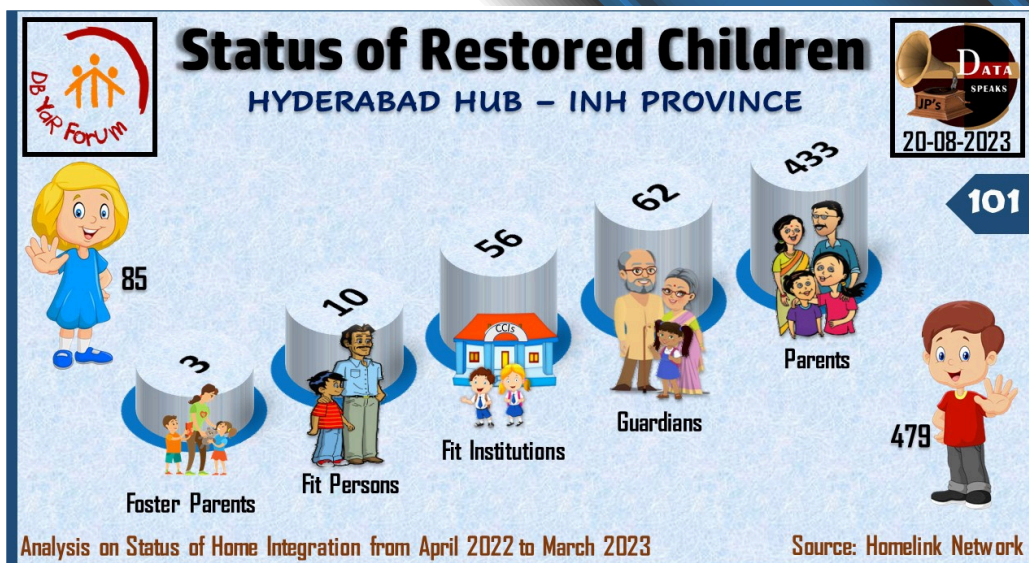
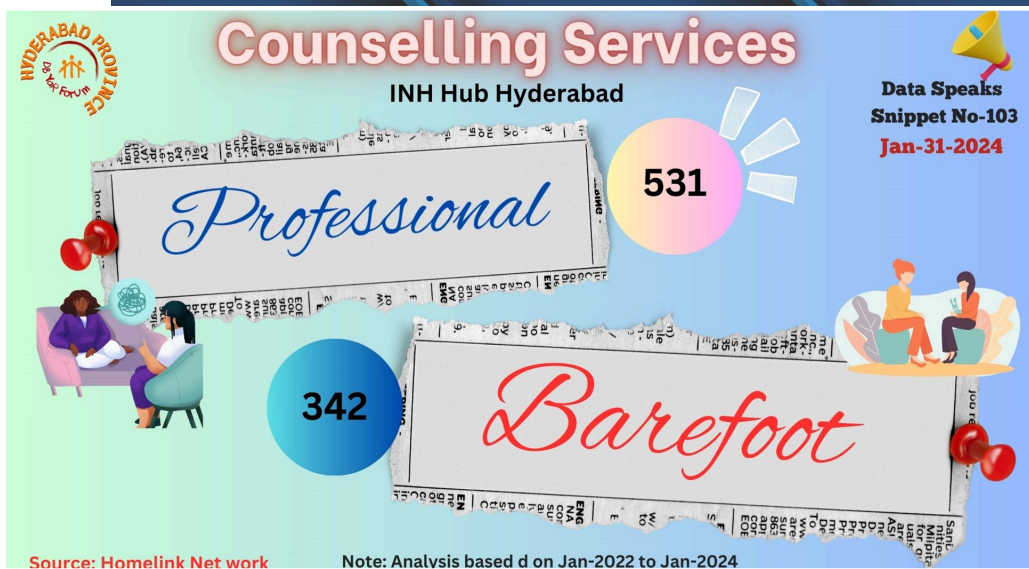
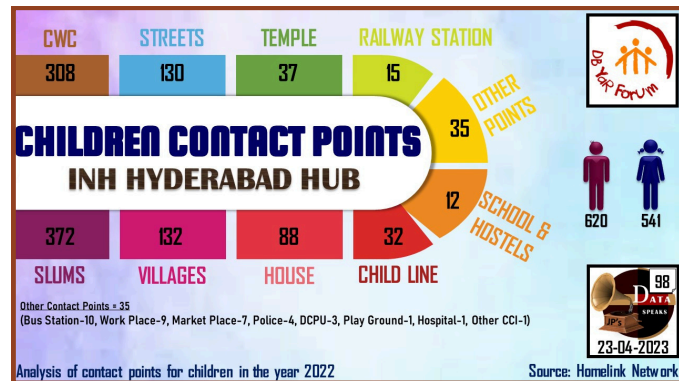
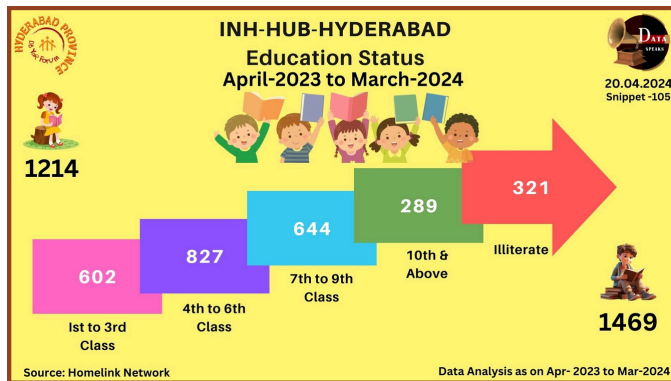
# Data Analysis through Snippets

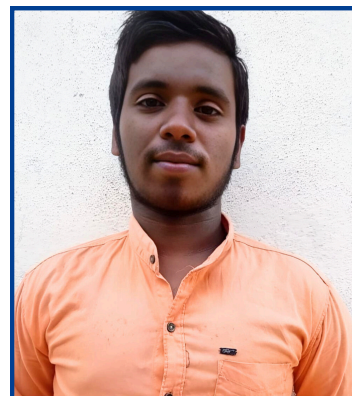

# Success Stories

## 01. Dondapati Naresh

This is the success story of D. Naresh, a boy with both parents. However, three years ago, his father left the family, leaving them behind. Naresh now lives with his mother, younger sister, and younger brother. Without their father's support and with his whereabouts unknown, Naresh's mother struggles to provide for the family and ensure the children's education.

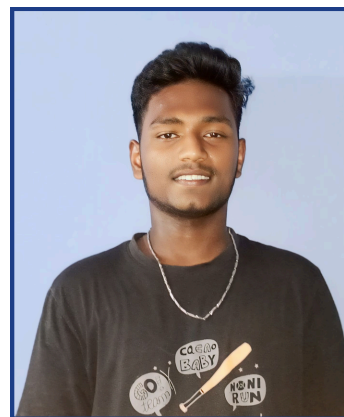


When Naresh's mother shared their difficulties with the sisters in their neighborhood, they advised her to seek help from the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). The CWC then referred them to Navajeevan Bala Bhavan- Deepanivas for assistance.

In 2021, Naresh joined Deepanivas and enrolled in the 8th grade at Kowtha Subbarao High School. He is now in the 10th grade and has excelled with an outstanding score of 501 out of 600. They are grateful for the support and opportunities provided to him.

## 02. Anirudh Raj

Anirudh Raj's journey has been a tough one, filled with challenges and temptations. Despite working hard, he struggled with the science subject and didn't pass his 10th Standard exams. This setback was just the beginning of a series of tough times for him. Anirudh had already lost his father to cancer when he was in 6th standard, which left him feeling sad and lost. Even though his family, including his mom, grandparents, and uncle, cared for him deeply, he still felt trapped in his problems.



Staying at the hostel led Anirudh to friends who negatively influenced him, starting with smoking cigarettes and progressing to alcohol and sedatives. He became addicted to marijuana and often felt lost and alone.

His family sought help from the Bosco Deaddiction Center in Nuzvid. Initially tough, Anirudh gradually accepted his situation and benefited from counseling and detox therapies. A turning point was receiving praise for anchoring an event, which motivated him towards positive change. The wisdom from the NJBB team and the trust shown by the Center Incharge, inspired him to pursue a life free from addiction.

Now reunited with his family, Anirudh is eager to embrace normalcy and leave addiction behind moving ahead towards his further education.

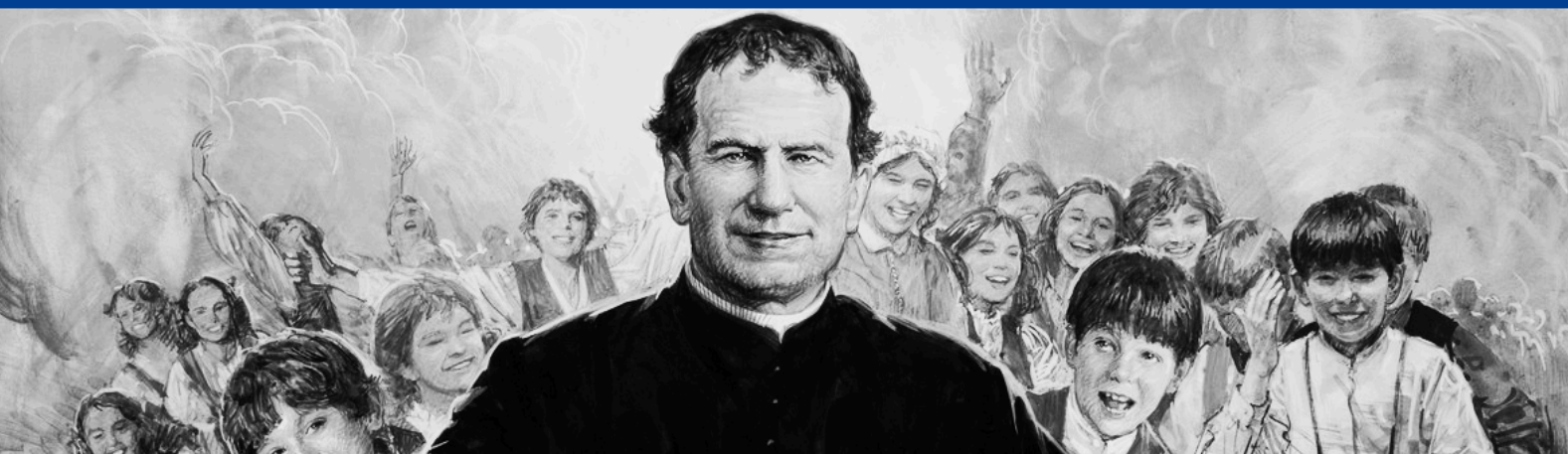
