
## Yar Coordinator's Message



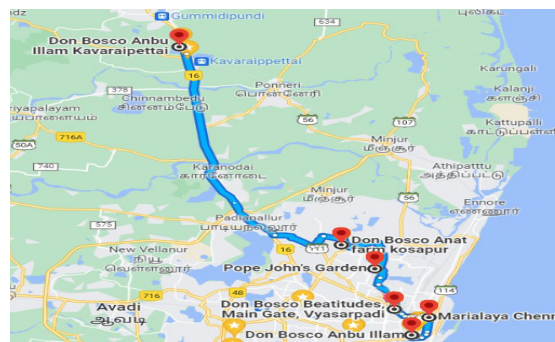

It provides shelter facilities, education programs, vocational, skill development training, medical assistance, after care program and community outreach programs to empower individuals with the necessary tools for personal and professional growth.

### Node visit report

There are 6 Nodes under Chennai Hub. Node visits are done prior to an appointment fixed on monthly basis. Here's a summarized variety of the key points addressed during the monthly node visits:

- Regular monitoring of performance metrics to assess progress and identify areas for improvement.
- Compile necessary reports for the organization, providing insights into node activities and outcomes.
- Develop and update formats as needed for documenting processes and data collection.
- Visualize project workflows through flowcharts to enhance understanding and streamline processes.
- Ensure proper maintenance of all registers and documentation to uphold organizational standards and facilitate accountability.
- Provide technical assistance, possibly from a national technical team, to troubleshoot any issues that arise.
- Identifying new needs or challenges that may arise within the nodes.
- Provide training sessions to enhance team members' skills in creating snippets and infographics for effective communication and outreach.
- Ensure adherence to Don Bosco Standards of Care, maintaining quality and consistency across projects.
- Invest in the professional development of team members through capacity-building initiatives and training programs.
- Collaboratively develop action plans for the following month, outlining tasks and objectives to be completed.

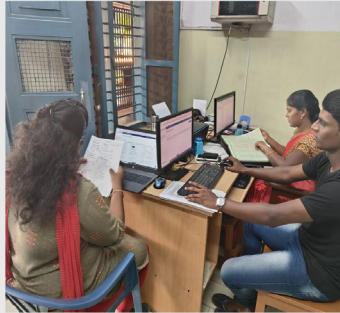

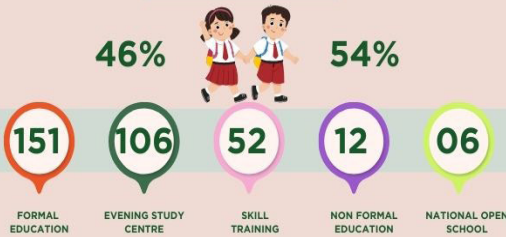

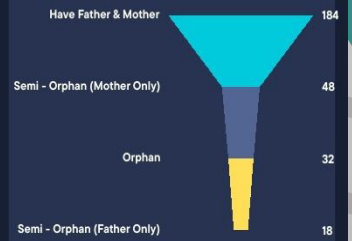

The INM Province organized the National YaR Seminar in collaboration with the DB National Forum for the Young at Risk. The event took place at the Don Bosco Animation Centre in Ennore, Chennai, on the 20th and 21st of September, 2023. Participants from all 11 provinces of YaR networking partners attended the seminar. The event focused on the theme of promoting a healthy mind and a healthy life, providing in-depth insights and knowledge. Panel discussions were held to strategize and project the next level activities at the province level.

### Homelink Network Training Programme

On 22nd and 23rd September 2023, the National Homelink Team conducted a two-day training programme for all Homelink Hub Coordinators at Don Bosco Youth Animation Centre in Ennore, Chennai. The training covered definitions of Juvenile Justice Acts related to centre types, demonstrated the use of Homelink DIGI worksheets and included sessions on capacity building by Fr. Thomas Saveri George, node-level operations by Fr. Aquinas Thomas and mini research techniques by Fr. Joe Prabhu. The programme concluded with discussions on plans and target setting, aiming to enhance operational efficiency and effectiveness across the network.

### Orientation to Inters from Social Work Departments



On 19th October 2023, we conducted a professional orientation session for 28 interns and 3 faculty members from CTTE College and Stella Maris College (MSW Departments). The session provided a comprehensive overview of Child MISS, emphasizing the critical importance of systematic

documentation in addressing child-related issues within the legal framework. Participants gained valuable insights into best practices for data management and the significance of meticulous record-keeping in both legal and organizational contexts. Feedback underscored the session's effectiveness in translating theoretical knowledge into practical application, enhancing the interns' preparedness for fieldwork.





### **Orientation on Staffing Patterns, Roles, and Responsibilities at Child Care Institutions.**

The orientation session on staffing patterns, roles, and responsibilities at Child Care Institutions (CCIs) held with the Homelink Network Partners of the INM Province was a pivotal professional engagement aimed at ensuring compliance with the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015. Directors, staff members, and the stakeholders convened to gain a comprehensive understanding of the mandated staffing structures and individual responsibilities outlined in the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015. Through detailed presentations and interactive discussions, participants were equipped with the knowledge and tools necessary to effectively fulfill their roles within CCIs. Emphasis was placed on the critical need for adherence to legal regulations to uphold the quality of care provided to children under the institution's guardianship. By fostering a culture of collaboration and continuous learning, this session served as a foundational step towards enhancing the professionalism and efficacy of childcare practices within the INM Province's Homelink Network.





## Digital Documentation Meeting at Node Level

The meeting centered on digital documentation at the node level and was marked by significant progress and strategic initiatives. A meticulous review of mandatory registers revealed a commendable standard of maintenance, reflecting the team's dedication to upholding organizational protocols. A pivotal outcome was the preparation of a comprehensive report, meticulously compiled to encapsulate pertinent data, subsequently entrusted to the data entry staff for diligent updating. Furthermore, the conducted training sessions, meticulously tailored to cover essential modules such as Child Services, Caring Community, Follow-ups, and Events, underscored the commitment to proficiency and uniformity across operational domains. This proactive approach not only ensures the integrity of our documentation but also reinforces a culture of excellence within the organization.



## National Director Visitation at Hub Level

During the visitation by Fr. Joe Prabu, the National Director of Homelink Network, accompanied by Mrs. Jyothi Priya, key agenda items were meticulously addressed at Anbagam, Don Bosco Anbu Illam, Chennai, and Don Bosco Beatitudes. The engagement included a thorough inspection of the nodes, extensive discussions with staff members and a comprehensive review of mandatory registers, all aimed at ensuring compliance with the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015. Emphasizing the significance of data integrity, Fr. Joe Prabu provided clear directives for the timely completion of pending data tasks, stressing their migration to the new Homelink DIGI online web portal server by mid-January 2024. Moreover, targeted meetings with Node Directors enabled in-depth assessments of node status and facilitated strategic discussions to address any outstanding challenges.





### Homelink DIGI Launch at Goa

In January, the National Team conducted a three-day training program on Homelink DIGI from the 17th to the 19th, facilitated by the Elite team. The training aimed to familiarize all hub coordinators with the functionalities of the new web tool, Homelink DIGI, incorporating discussions based on



participants' inputs. A significant highlight was a panel discussion where hub coordinators elucidated the new features and advantages of Homelink DIGI to all attendees. The program culminated on the final day with the official launch of the website, followed by a concluding session.

### Session on ICP, Counselling & Registers Maintenance

The training session on Individual Child Care Plans (ICP) and counselling held on March 15, 2024, at Pope John's Garden was marked by a comprehensive agenda aimed at enhancing the expertise of participants from various Youth at Risk (YaR) Centers across the INM Province. Welcoming address by Fr. Andrews Stephen Raj, the Hub Director of INM Province, the session progressed



with Mrs. Dorathy Joseph, a seasoned Child Welfare officer, delving into the significance of ICPs for children in diverse circumstances. Mrs. Joseph provided detailed insights into the different sections and formats of the ICP, accompanied by practical guidelines for proper completion and coordination with relevant personnel. Moreover, the presentation on the Homelink DIGI tool by Ms. Jyothi Priya, alongside counselling inputs and register maintenance protocols, underscored the commitment to equipping participants with essential skills and resources



for effective child care management. With the participation of 5 Directors and 21 staff members from prominent YaR Centers, the session fostered a professional exchange of knowledge and practices aimed at nurturing holistic child development within institutional settings.

### Session on Behavioral issues & Family Bonding

On March 19, 2024, at Marialaya in Chennai, facilitated a comprehensive session addressing behavioral issues and family bonding for a group of 53 participants, encompassing girls, management and staff. Assisted by Mrs. Jyothi Priya, Hub Coordinator of INM Province, the session delved into the pressing challenges concerning the mental well-being and behavioral dynamics encountered by children, especially those within Child Care Institutions. Employing a multifaceted approach,



including interactive activities, icebreakers and PowerPoint presentations, ensured active engagement and comprehension among attendees. Emphasis was placed on the pivotal role of family bonding in fostering the emotional and psychological growth of children, underscoring the significance of nurturing supportive familial environments for their holistic development. The session's interactive nature facilitated open

communication, enabling participants to articulate their concerns and seek clarification. Feedback at the session's conclusion served to identify specific challenges faced by the children, thereby informing future intervention strategies. Additionally, the display of Healthy Mind and Healthy Life posters underscored the importance of prioritizing mental wellness.

### Session on Healthy Parenting & Family Bonding at Marialaya, Chennai

The session on healthy parenting and family bonding at Marialaya, Chennai, held on 24th March 2024, under the guidance of Mrs. Jyothi Priya, the Hub Coordinator of the INM Province, was a pivotal event aimed at fostering holistic family dynamics. With 53 engaged participants, including staff, children and parents, the session delved into critical aspects of familial relationships. Topics ranging from the definition and structure of family to the significance of family life in child



development were thoroughly explored. Moreover, practical insights into healthy parenting practices and strategies for promoting familial cohesion were provided. Emphasis was placed on the essential role of mental health and well-being for parents, underlining the importance of self-care and support systems. By equipping participants with actionable knowledge and tools, the session sought to empower families to cultivate resilient and fulfilling relationships, thereby contributing to their overall welfare and stability.

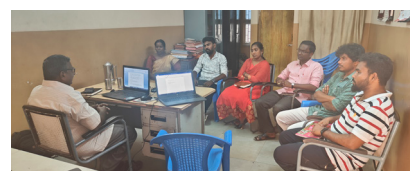
### Don Bosco Standards of Care at Hub Level

The recent social audit led by Fr. Joe Prabu, along with the INM YaR Commission team, encompassed several prominent organizations including Bosco Illam, Saranalayam, Don Bosco Beattitudes, Anbagam, Marialaya and Don Bosco Anbu Illam, Kavarapettai. The primary focus of this audit was to bolster organizational efficiency by ensuring



meticulous documentation practices. Through targeted training sessions, directors and coordinators were equipped with the requisite knowledge and skills essential for maintaining systematic documentation. Emphasizing the significance of accurate reporting and thorough record-keeping, the training underscored the critical role such practices play in delivering high-quality

care and effectively monitoring the progress and well-being of the youth under their care. The audit meticulously scrutinized mandatory registers, organization-specific certificates, infrastructure details and the implementation of organizational policies, thus laying a solid foundation for future endeavours and ensuring adherence to best practices.



### Hostel Act Guidelines at Province Level

Training focused on the Hostel Act as well as the documentation of the procedures. The trainings were specifically delivered to Hostels within the Chennai Hub, indicating a targeted effort to strengthen their understanding and implementation of relevant legal frameworks and documentation practices. By providing these trainings, valuable knowledge and guidance were shared with the Hostels,



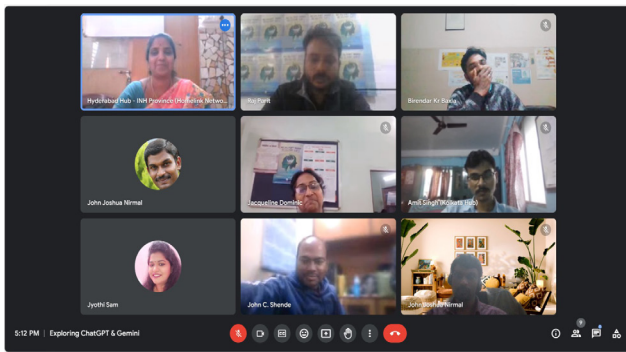
empowering them to ensure compliance with relevant and establish effective documentation systems.

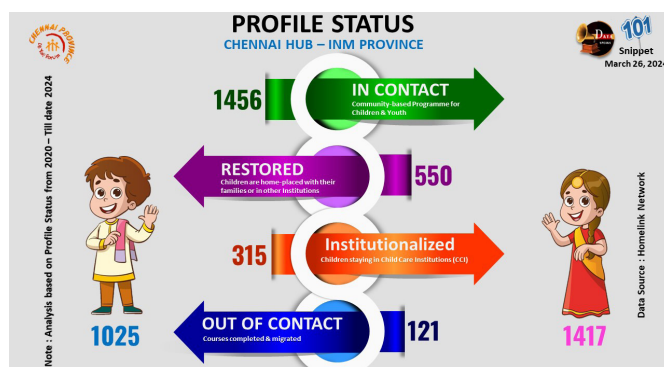
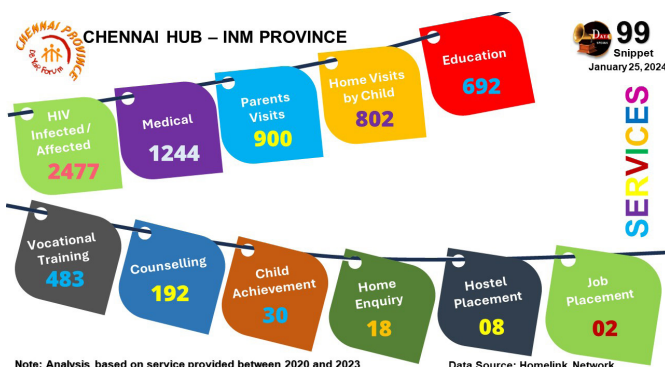
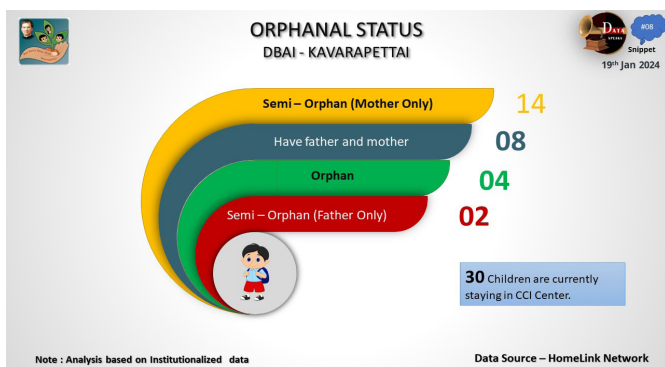
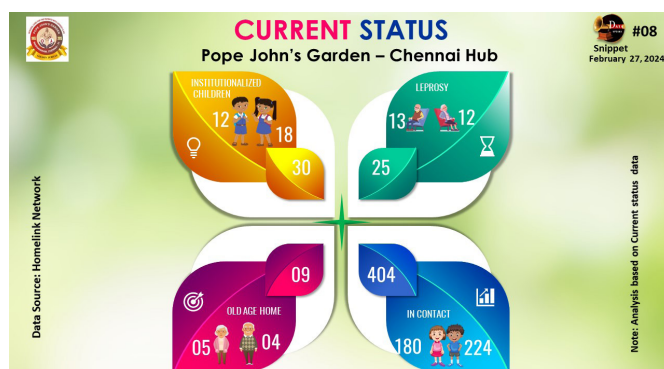
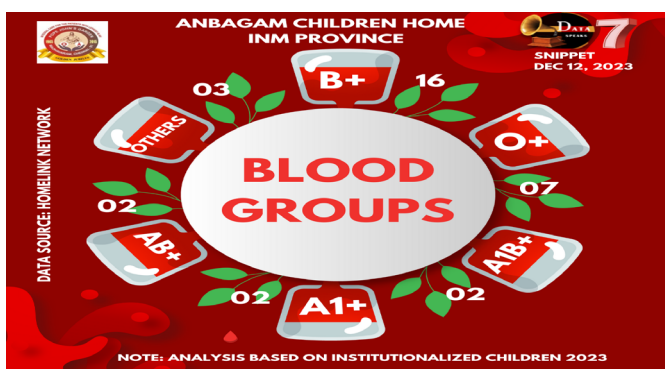
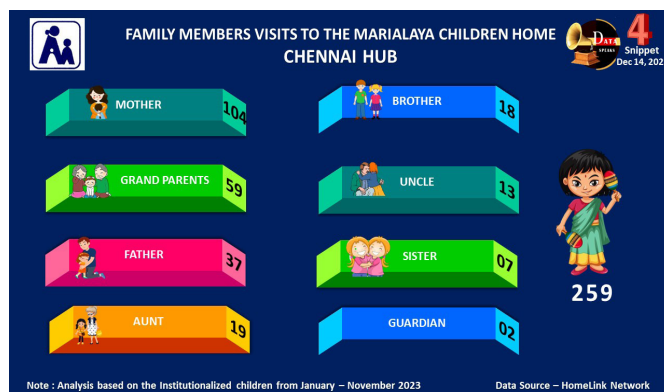
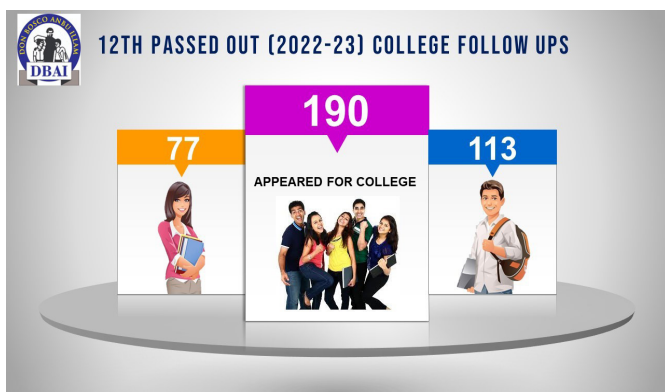


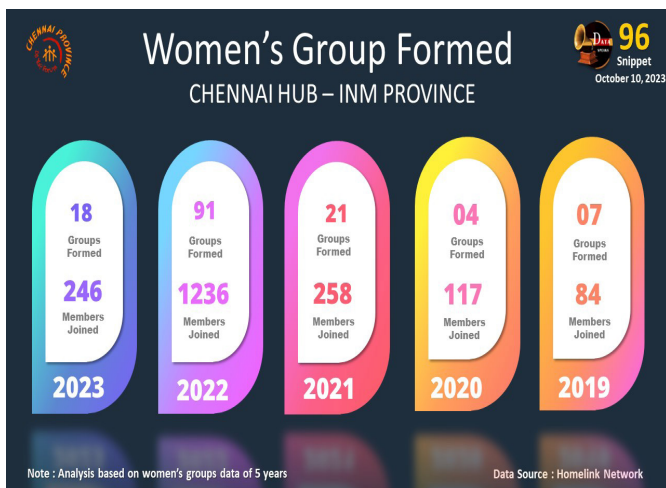
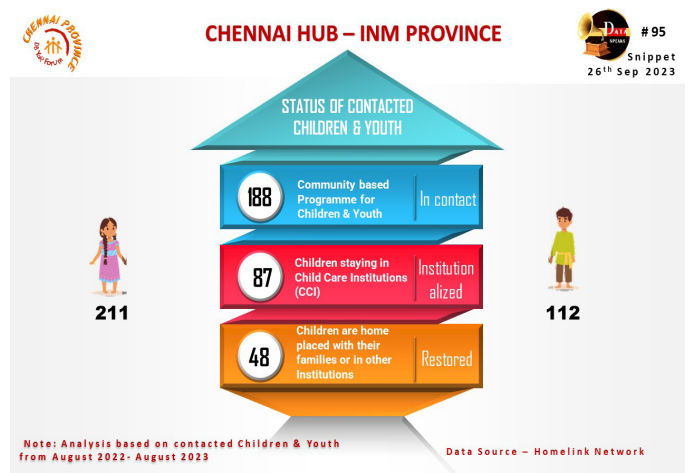
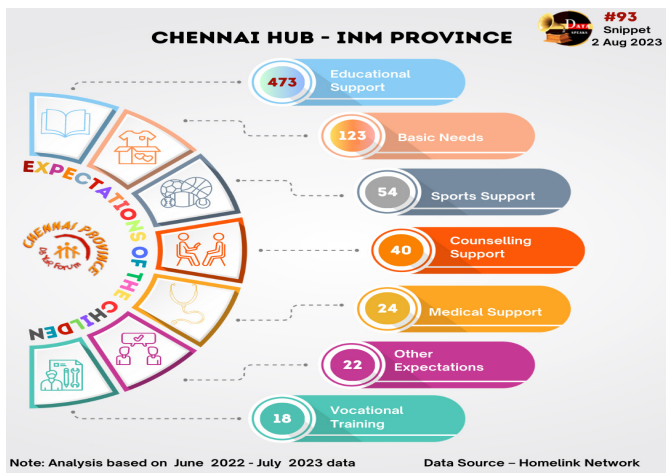
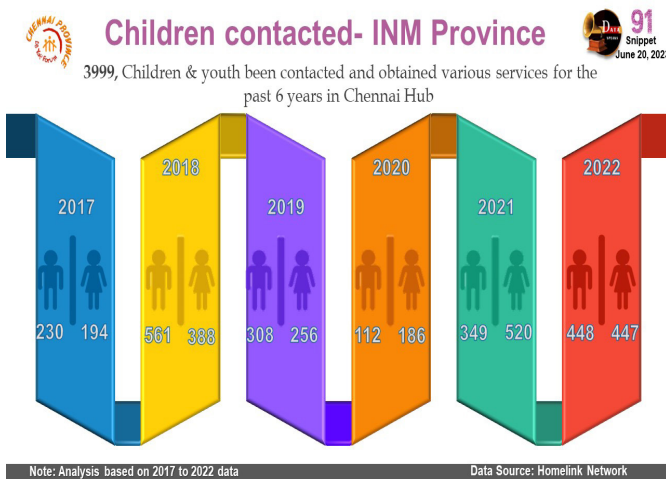
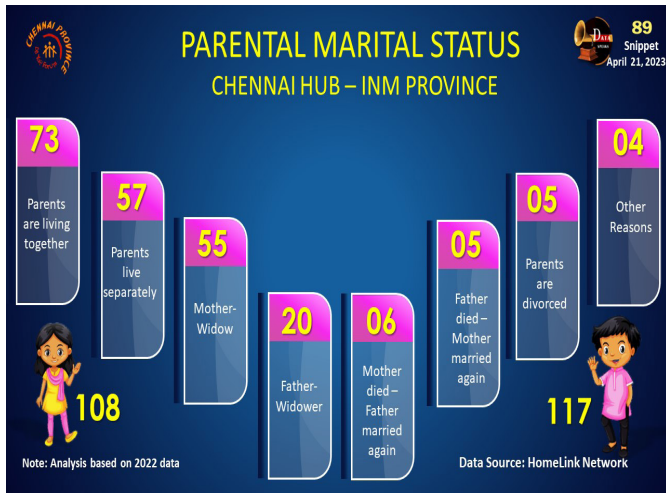


## Snippets

### Stop Bullying & Cyber Bullying

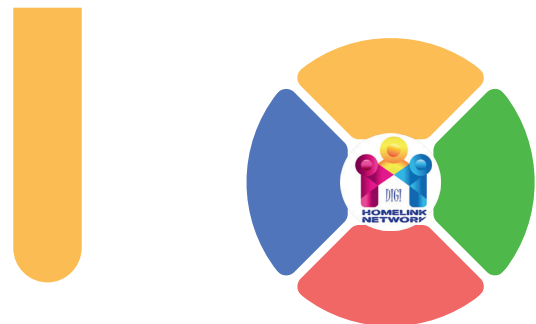

Today, he is a dedicated life skills trainer and coordinator for rehabilitation programs, passionately advocating for first-time offenders and juveniles across Tamil Nadu.



In recognition of his impactful work, Haridas was honored with the Vikatan Top 10 Youth Icon Award 2023, presented by Director Vasanthabalan. He dedicated this prestigious accolade to those enhancing society, especially his mentor Fr. Vincent Xavier and Rev. Fr. Don Bosco, Provincial of INM Province. Currently, Haridas serves as a PATTAM project executive at Puzhal Prison and the Observation Home in Kelly's, Chennai, where he manages rehabilitation programs, facilitates family reconnections, aids in post-release employment, and assists school dropouts. Through PRISM TRUST, he also raises awareness of drug addiction and helps restore lives. Haridas expresses profound gratitude to all who have supported him on this remarkable journey.

## The Inspiring Journey of Ms. Megna

Ms. Megna is a 19 years old girl currently studying 2nd year in UG, whose lives had many twists and turns from the very early stage of life. She was grown up with the loving family of Father, Mother and an Elder sister. But their life suddenly slipped away when their mother died in 2010 and within 3 years, her father also passed away with the HIV infection.

With the support of their grandmother, they both were sent to school for two years but could not continue, as she was growing older and fell sick. So, her Grand Mother found them a shelter home to continue their education and keep them at a safer place. Meanwhile, her grandmother also passed away and no one was ready to care for them as they were seen as burdens to their families. After all the miseries, she was moved to our Shelter Home at Saranalayam, with the support of CWC and continued her school education from 6th standard to 12th standard. She studied well and actively participated in all the events and games during her stay in Saranalayam. Our staff cared for her and assured the feeling of love.



In her 12th board exams, she scored 437 marks and successfully joined in Bachelor of Physiotherapy in Jehovah institute of Paramedical with the support of DBAI in Chennai. We are happy to continually support our children until they become self-reliant.

She is one of the examples that we made efforts to fulfill the needs of the child including physical, educational, nutritional and psychological which help the child to climb the ladder in life. We believe that when we sow the best, the best will be reaped in future.
