It is vital information about the children in difficult circumstances, which will assist the networking organizations to strengthen the role of advocacy through legal provisions and law enforcement, review and reform child policy development, offer psychological counselling to children and parents, and raise the community consciousness and collaboration to create a safe environment for children. Thus Homelink through network partners will promote safety and protection to children.



For the last year, the theme of our YaR Day and Campaign was "Choose Life, Not Drugs." We had a monthly promotion of theme posters, infobits, and resource kits. YaR Centers have taken the initiative to organize various campaign programs throughout the year. This campaign created awareness about substance abuse among children and young adults.

This year's YaR Day and Campaign focused on "Healthy Mind, Healthy Life," aiming to raise awareness about the crucial connection between mental well-being and the overall quality of life of young adults. There was an online program for the closure of the last year's campaign and the launch of the 2023–2024 YaR Day campaign on August 31, 2023. The campaign poster "On Healthy Mind, Healthy Life" was launched, and the pledge of the last year's YaR campaign was reiterated.

Hub coordinators contributed by preparing flip books covering various topics related to the YaR campaign, which were then disseminated through awareness programs to reach all children effectively.





SOCIAL AUDIT

In the past year, the Social Audit team of INT embarked on a comprehensive assessment of our Child Care Institutions (CCIs) in alignment with the Juvenile Justice (JJ) Act. Each CCI underwent a thorough evaluation encompassing legal documentation, record-keeping, infrastructure compliance with JJ Act regulations, and the quality of services provided to the children under our care.

This dedicated effort allowed us to gain invaluable insights into our operational strengths, areas for improvement, and the extent to which we meet the benchmarks and standards set forth by the JJ Act for safeguarding and nurturing children in need of care and protection.













CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION ON "HEALTHY MIND, HEALTHY LIFE"

25thNovember 2023

Don Bosco Anbu Illam had organized a Children's Day program by conducting a conference on "Healthy Mind, Healthy Life" on November 25, 2023, at the Nirmala College campus. To highlight the theme of the conference during the inaugural session, the dignitaries released a dignitaries released a printed poster of the theme. Nearly 1200 (thousand and two hundred) 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students from fifteen (15) schools in Coimbatore participated and benefited a lot from this conference.







Salem Don Bosco Anbu Illam

Salem Don Bosco Anbu Illam orchestrated a joyous celebration in honor of Children's Day, extending its festivities to children residing in shelter homes, evening centers, and schools. This uplifting event spanned from November 13th to November 17th, 2023, unfolding at their respective locations. The festivities encompassed a diverse array of competitions. Impressively, a total of 1400 children from 45 villages, along with 304 schoolchildren, enthusiastically engaged in these festivities.











Namakkal Don Bosco Anbu Illam

A week-long competition was organized for the children of the Evening Study Center, as well as the sheltered children from Namakal Don Bosco Anbu Illam and St. Xavier's Children's Home. The event took place from November 9th to November 14th, 2023. Various competitions, including essay writing, poem writing, drawing, mono-act, mime, and Thirukural recitation, were conducted for these children. 102 children actively participated. A session on mental health, conducted by Ms. Archana from DMHP Namakkal, was also part of the event.







Tiruppur - Marialaya

The event took place on November 19th at Marialaya, Tiruppur, where approximately 300 children were transported via separate buses from villages. Children from various villages showcased cultural programs such as dance, speeches, songs, and dramas. The event concluded with a special lunch for all attendees.







Covai- Marialaya

The event was held on November 21, 2023, in Marialaya, Coimbatore, and was attended by nearly 120 children from the Marialaya shelter home and children from evening study centers. Competitions were held for different grade groups, and prizes were awarded. As a token, each child received a rose sapling, funded by Equitas Bank and the Coimbatore Rotary Club.











AWARENESS PROGRAMME FOR CHILDREN AND WOMEN ON "HEALTHY MIND, HEALTHY LIFE"

Session on Goal Setting, Substance prevention & Stress management:

187 students from Classes 10 and 11 at Presentation Convent participated in a dynamic three-hour workshop focused on goal setting, substance prevention, and stress management. The session was highly interactive, allowing students to actively engage with the material and benefit from practical exercises and discussions. By addressing these important topics, students gained valuable insights and skills to navigate their academic and personal lives more effectively. With a focus on empowerment and well-being, the workshop aimed to equip students with the tools they need to thrive both now and in the future.



Session Social Media - Boone Or Bane

In an engaging session held at Singanallur Corporation School, 85 bright young minds from classes 7th and 8th embarked on a thought-provoking journey to dissect the complexities of social media. Through interactive discussions and real-life examples, the children explored the positive aspects of social media, such as connectivity, information sharing, and creative expression. They also examined its negative impacts, including cyberbullying, addiction, and privacy concerns.



Session on Stress Management:

This empowering workshop aimed to equip participants with practical tools to navigate life's challenges with resilience and calm. Throughout the session, attendees engaged in interactive discussions, learning various stress reduction techniques tailored to their needs and lifestyles. From mindfulness exercises to time management strategies, each participant personalized discovered approaches alleviate stress and promote well-being. Additionally, the initiative extended its reach to the Shelter Children of Covai Marialaya, sensitizing around 30 young girls to the importance of stress management.



Children Parliament Meeting

Children within the community engaged in discussions concerning various topics such as education, health, sanitation, and sports, as well as expressed their concerns regarding protection during Children's Parliament meetings. These sessions aimed to equip them with the skills necessary to organize such meetings, fostering leadership qualities from an early age.





YaR SEMINAR & HLK DISCUSSION

20th to 23rd September 2023

A YaR Seminar was held on the national YaR theme "Healthy Mind, Healthy Life" at Chennai Provincial House from September 20th to 23rd, 2023. All the Hub Coordinators and Directors from all YaR centers at the national level took part in the event. During the seminar campaign, posters were released by all the participants.

There was also discussion on the new the new Homelink web tool. We had a virtual meeting with the Eliat team and discussed the process undergone in the development of modules. All the hub coordinators were trained on designing tools.











CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING & LAUNCH OF HOMELINK DIGI

In January, a three-day training program was conducted by the National Team on Homelink Digi, spanning from the 17th to the 19th. INT Province Silver Jubilee Symposium

As a component of the promotion campaign for the newly upgraded web tool, Homelink DIGI, the Coimbatore hub actively participated in the INT Province Silver Jubilee Symposium held on February 15th at Alaihal Media College, Trichy. During the event, the team delivered a presentation highlighting the advanced features of Homelink DIGI. Approximately 250 members, including directors, staff, and members of Don Bosco Centers from Trichy and Chennai Province, as well as Marialaya sisters, were in attendance at the symposium.

Following the Homelink Digi Presentation at the INT Silver Jubilee Symposium, a meeting was held with Rev. Fr. Agilan, Provincial of Trichy Province, during his visit to Don Bosco Anbu Illam on March 7th, 2024. Discussions centered around the implementation of Homelink Digi in the INT province. An appointment was secured for an online meeting with all Yar directors to further discuss the strategy for implementing the upgraded documentation tool.

Homelink Annual Activity Report & Social Audit Tool Presentation in INT Yar Sector Meeting


As the new academic year commences, the annual YaR Sector Meeting is convened in INT Province, serving as a platform to review the accomplishments of the past year and strategize for the upcoming one. At this year's gathering, the Hub Coordinator took the opportunity to deliver a comprehensive presentation on the status of documentation standards at YaR Centers over the preceding year.



Furthermore, the meeting provided an opportunity to introduce the Social Audit Tool to all node directors. The purpose was to familiarize them with the process of social auditing and equip them with the necessary knowledge to navigate forthcoming audits effectively. To this end, specific dates for audits at each center were established, ensuring ample time for preparation and readiness to address any audit-related queries or concerns.

Online Monthly Meetings for Node Staff

Monthly meetings conducted online aimed to assess the report quality and provide instructions for upcoming month activities. During these sessions, the Node data entry staff presented their monthly activity reports, including the number of data entries made, analysis reports presented through graphs and charts, and updates on other office tasks completed. This presentation format proved beneficial for sharing knowledge and fostering mutual learning among the node staff, aiding in their professional development and presentation skills. 12 node visits were completed from April 2023 to March 2024.







Node Monitoring Visitation

Regular monitoring of the nodes under the Coimbatore hub was conducted to track web tool usage. The review encompassed both the quality and quantity of the data, ensuring that all organizational activities, including services to children, were comprehensively documented in the web tool.

During these monitoring visits, the data entry staff received motivation and encouragement to consistently input data. Any uncertainties regarding the tool's modules were clarified, and technical issues, if identified, were promptly resolved with the assistance of the national team. Additionally, hands-on training was provided to the staff on report generation and snippet preparation to enhance their proficiency in utilizing the tool effectively.


















Infographic Report

Infographic reports are prepared every month, and they are shared with all the node directors and staff to make them visible in the data entry status of their own organization and the standard of data entered by their staff. Through the sharing of informational reports with all the node directors, they compare their organization with other organizations and encourage their staff to make entries regularly. The gaps in the data entered were also noticed by the directors, and accordingly, they intervened with the concern staff.







Snippets




Hub Monthly & Ri Wookly Montings with Nation






Training for Newly Appointed Hub Coordinators

Training on Children Parliament:


