Thus, a systematic organizational flowchart was framed, and child flow infographic reports were generated for each of the nodes.

We have 84 organizations in our Homelink network which have been registered as partner organizations. We are grateful to all the heads of the organizations, hub directors, node



DON BOSCO NATIONAL FORUM FOR THE YOUNG AT RISK

Don Bosco National Forum for the Young at Risk (DB YaR Forum) is a network of groups and organizations committed to the safety, growth, development, and rights of vulnerable, marginalized children and young adults who need care and protection or who are in-conflict with the law. Currently, the network has 80+ member institutions and organizations from across 19 states and union territories of India. Services we offer to young people include street/railway platform/ bus station presences, rescue teams, drop-in centers, open



shelters, children's homes, youth hostels, after-care facilities, and HomeLink / Missing Children. We accompany the Young at Risk, to provide for them care and protection, conducive spaces to live, work together and develop, and environments of rights, participation and dignity.

CHILD (MISS) MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM & SERVICES

Child MISS (Management Information System and Services) is an online web portal for effective data management, monitoring, and reporting. It is a tool that provides a systematic and secure platform to document all the needs of Young at Risk. The web tool is also linked with other value-added tools like Mobile App, Power BI, technologies to provide 360-degree capacity building at node and hub levels. It also helps the partner organization in the preparation and publication of research and resource documents, micro-studies and data snippets.

The tool aims to create awareness and skills enhancement of children and organization through data and to help them reflect on their contexts and situations and to contribute to the decision-making, organizational promoting children's participation in decision-making according to their evolving capacities. Currently, more than 100 non-governmental organizations are using the web portal to document all their services and follow up in a single-window system to enhance their mission for children at risk more effectively and efficiently.



HOMELINK Network

HomeLink Network is an ongoing initiative started by DB YaR Forum in 2002. The objective of the project is to ensure appropriate, timely and realtime response to the needs of the young at risk, based on accurate documentation and data analysis supported by the best of technologies available today. It enables organisations to develop a culture of data led management, monitoring, reporting, intervention planning, and facilitates predictive intervention planning by responding to evolving scenarios of the young at risk.





The HomeLink Network is implemented across India through 8 Hubs. Where Hubs are a group of YaR Centers in a province and Nodes are individual YaR Center. At present 93 member organizations of HomeLink Network are interconnected through the web tool Child MISS (Child Management Information Systems and Services), which has the data of over 326,000 children accumulated over the years. The tool has played a key role in facilitating the restoration. home placement, of over 112,000 children. Between 2014 and 2021, the number of whose details have children been recorded in the Child MISS tool is 96018, of whom 60,681 have been restored to their families or guardians.


- Follow-up is another module of Child MISS where organizations recorded their followup of services for the individual child.


In-Contact children include all the children who are not placed in our network institution but are supported by the institutions. 3777, children are received various services through outreach activities.






IN-CONTACT Status





- A weekly edition of these snippets are posted in the DB YaR Forum Instagram handle @Dbyarforum.




IMPLEMENTATION OF CHILD CATEGORY




The child category is a major factor in understanding the situation of children. Don Bosco YaR Forum/ Homelink Network found that the child categories are different in different parts of India, North East has a higher number of school dropout children, and Bangalore has street children but, Delhi has more missing and child labor cases.

The meeting focused on discussion with regional coordinators using everywhere to understand the purpose of collecting the data for the child categories. After several discussions with regional coordinators, Homelink made modifications to the Child MISS web tool and implemented the formats to collect the data on the child category.



ECO CLUB PROJECT TESTING FORMATS FOR FIVE ZONE



TRAINING ON HIV INFECTED- CHILD CATEGORY




HELP AND RESCUE TRAINING FOR DELHI HUB

The National Team arranged a session to train the Hub Coordinators on the usefulness of snippets and it's ability to create visibility to the work done by the organization in reaching the unreached.




The session also focused on the possibility of making snippets in the regional language for a better reach.










POWER BI TRAINING

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INFOGRAPHICS IN CANVA & PIKTOCHART




CHILD MISS REQUIREMENTS

HOMELINK HUB WEEKLY MEETINGS


