Their parents, Sunita and Rahul, smiled at each other. "That's right," said Sunita. "Each milestone, no matter how different, is a reflection of how we



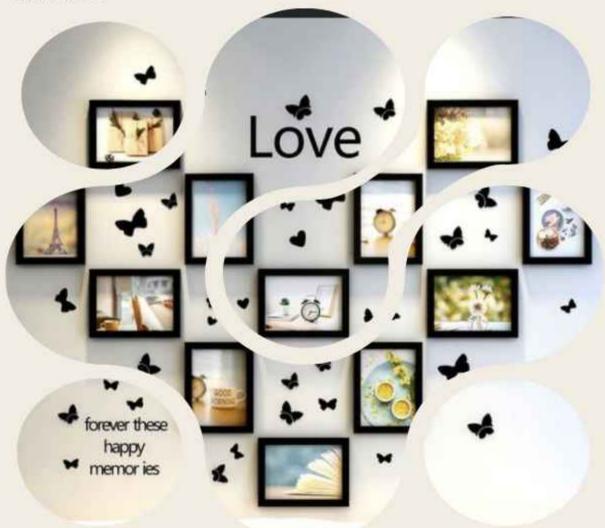




Conclusion
